# Matter arising out of the minutes :

The demand of the students regarding extension of lending hours of the University Library was discussed at length. The members felt that students would be very much benefitted if the lending hours be extended.

It was therefore resolved that in the interest of the students the lending hours of the University Library will henceforth be extended upto 5-30 p.m. as against the present 4-30 p.m. and the requisition slips will be accepted daily between 10-30 a.m. to 2 p.m. to enable the students to borrow books between 12 noon to 5-30 p.m.

The extended lending hours will be effective from the date to be decided by the Vice-Chancellor.

The Deputy Librarian was requested to change the duty hours of the staff of the concerned sections accordingly.

Agenda 2: To consider the budget proposals for the year 2001-2002 and the revised estimate, 2000-2001 of the University Library.

Decision: The budget proposals were approved with some modifications.

1. Expenditure for remuneration of the casual staff were made earlier from working expenses. It was resolved that henceforth the wages of the Casual Staff of the University Library will be incurred from the University budget head, 'Leave Reservist Fund'.

- 1. Agenda 3: To discuss subscription process of periodicals.

Decision: The Vice-Chancellor informed the members that all the periodicals including current contents on CD-ROM that were subscribed in 2000 would be renewed for 2001.

The members noted that an approximate amount of R. 32 lakhs would be required for renewing the periodicals for 2001.

The Finance Officer was requested to release cheques/drafts etc. for the Invoices/bills of the periodicals for 2001 within November 2000 so that the supply of 2001 periodicals may commence from January.

Agenda 4: To report the progress achieved so far in respect of department-wise purchase of books for 9th Plan and data entry work under INFLIBNET programme.

Decision: The members were informed regarding the progress achieved so far in respect of purchase of books for 9th plan and it was duly noted.

It was reported that data entry work under INFLIBNET programme is in progress and at present the Library is creating the journals database with complete holdings for the period from 1962 to 2000.

Agenda 5: To consider if ex-students be permitted to use the Library for NET/SLET and other competitive examinations and also for preparation of synopsis for Ph.D.

Decision: It was resolved that students who passed any post-graduate examination of this University and intend to use the University Idbrary for NET/SLET and other competitive examinations and also for preparation of synopsis for Ph.D shall be allowed to use the Library for a period not exceeding six months on payment of R. 100/- per month or at a time R. 300/-. They shall be allowed to use Journal Section, Reading Room, Reference and Computer Section of the Library. However, they shall not be eligible to borrow any book from the Library and shall not be permitted to use the Stack Room.

It was further resolved that NET/SLET qualified students of this University shall enjoy the above facilities free of cost for six months.

Agenda 6: To report that some books issued to the users long age have not yet been returned.

Decision: It was reported that a good number of users inspite of several reminders have not yet returned the library books. It was also reported that the library has prepared a list of defaulting members who are holding the books for a long time.

The Deputy Librarian was advised to forward the list to the Vice-Chancellor for further necessary action.

Agenda 7: To report that the University Library needs some special funds for purchase of racks to accommodate loose and bound journals and also for binding of back files of journals.

Decision : The issue was discussed.

The members agreed in principle the need for allocation of some special funds for purchase of racks and also for binding of back files of journals but in view of the present financial constraint it was decided that the matter of allocation of special funds for the purpose would be considered as and when fund is available.

Agenda 8: To report regarding INTERNET and E-mail services of the University Library.

Decision: The members were informed that all categories of users are making the maximum use of the INTERNET and E-mail facilities.

It was reported that the cost of printing from INTERNET is not in conformity with the charges realised.

It was therefore decided that only the downloading charge (printing from the Net) be increased from R. 1 to R. 3/- per page (for image R. 6/-) with immediate effect. Other charges, however will remain unchanged.
