OBJECTIVE OF THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF
NORTH BENGAL.

The need for establishment of New Universities in West Bengal was being acknowledged on all hands. The Burdwan University Act, 1959 and the Kalyani University Act 1960 have recently been passed by the State Legislature. The Calcutta University has for a long time served the cause of higher education not only in Bengal but for large areas outside Bengal. But in recent years the demands for higher education has so much increased that the facilities which can be offered by the colleges and the Calcutta University itself are proving too inadequate to cope with the growing number, particularly in respect of post - graduate classes.

In 1948 the number of students who appeared for Intermediate, First Degree and Post Graduate examinations of the Calcutta University were respectively + 12,556, 4,068 and 900. The corresponding number in 1960 was 52,597, 21,891 and 2,190. In order that greater facilities for higher education at the Under - Graduate (including Honours) and Post - graduate stage may be provided, particularly for the students of the colleges in the Districts of North Bengal, legislation was taken in hand for the establishment of a teaching and affiliating University for the Northern Districts of West Bengal.

The North Bengal University Bill 1961 was passed by both the Houses of the State Legislature in November 1961. The Bill became an Act on being assented to by the President of India in December, 1961. The Act was published in an Extraordinary issue of the Calcutta Gazette dated 15th December, 1961. In pursuance of Sub - Section (2) of Section 1 of the North Bengal University Act, 1961, the Act has been brought into force with effect from the 15th day of May, 1962.

Professor B. N. Das Gupta, A.C.A., F.C.A., Retired Dean of the Faculty of Commerce and Business Administration, Lucknow University has been appointed to be the Vice-Chancellor of the new University, whose Headquarters will be at Siliguri (vide Section 14 of the Act). Prof. Das Gupta took over charge of the office of the Vice-Chancellor on the forenoon of 1st June, 1962.

Proceedings of the First Meeting of the
University of North Bengal held at Raj
Bhawan, Darjeeling, at 10-30 A.M. on the
5th June, 1962.

The Chancellor, who presided over the meeting, stated* at the outset that while this meeting was the small beginning of what she hoped would ultimately be a big achievement, the importance of the North Bengal University lay in the fact that not only would it provide adequate educational facilities for the people of the northern districts but also on the psychological effect that it would have on all those who had hitherto felt - perhaps with a certain amount of justification - that they have been not only very much isolated from the rest of the State during recent years but also neglected. Wherever the Chancellor had toured in the North Bengal, she found that feeling among all sections of the people and she hoped they would now feel that this University was going to be a centre for the education of their children and, what was more important, was going to open fresh avenues of employment in the future.

The entire area of North Bengal comprising the districts of Malda, West Dinajpur, Jalpaiguri, Cooch Behar and Darjeeling were vulnerable from the political point of view. In addition to Pakistan, there were Bhutan and Sikkim and Nepal which bordered on Tibet and China. The Chancellor, therefore, felt strongly that this area should be developed from the politically, socially, economically and from educational points of view.

The Chancellor mentioned that when she last met Father Stanford of St. Joseph's, he sought her advice as to the reply he should send to letters still being received by him from parents of students expressing their anxiety on account of the presence of the Chinese on our border.

*Summary of the speech.

The Chancellor suggested to Father Stanley that he should inform the anxious parents that there obviously could be no cause for panic when the Government of West Bengal was spending vast sums in setting up a new University in North Bengal. Even the announcement of the Government's intention to set up this University had itself brought about a new atmosphere of hope and confidence among the people of this area.

The Chancellor sounded a note of caution with regard to the architecture, building, equipment, furniture, etc., of the new University. She had noticed a tendency to import not only workers but also materials from outside when any new institution was being built. It would be a serious mistake if this policy was adopted here. It was essentially necessary, the Chancellor stressed, that as far as practicable, the task of building the University should be entrusted to the people of this area. The people of each district of North Bengal should be made to feel that this would be an institution of their own that would ultimately change the face of North Bengal.

The Chancellor confessed that she was almost fanatical about utilising local talent and resources. She pointed out that local timber was plentiful, beautiful textiles were made by the Kalimpong Arts and crafts, the Tibetan carpenters were very efficient and there was no dearth of good artisans and masons in this area. Due to the stoppage of trade between India and Tibet, there was widespread unemployment in Kalimpong. Large number of cobblers, tailors, workers of wool godowns, muleteers had been thrown out of employment following the stoppage of Indo-Tibetan trade. The Government of West Bengal had decided to implement a number of schemes in order to utilise local resources and also to provide work to this large number of unemployed people. It was unwise to keep so many people unemployed and dissatisfied.

The Chancellor explained that in the context of what she had stated steps might be taken to give a concrete shape to the new University. Things would have to be rushed through because delay was dangerous. If necessary, the Chancellor suggested, certain formalities might be waived while the buildings were in the process of construction. The Chancellor once again referred to the architecture of the buildings of the University which should not only be attractive but should also

to meet the different styles of architecture in vogue in these regions; from the Chancellor pointed out that steps should be taken to prepare the scheme for the planting of trees on the campus.

up a The Vice-Chancellor then thanked the Chancellor for her opening statement, which he thought would be extremely valuable in the development of the new University.

The Chancellor further observed that the construction of the Administrative building, some quarters for officers and teachers and hostels for the students should be taken in hand at the earliest.

At the suggestion of the Chancellor it was also resolved that the Vice-Chancellor be authorized to rent suitable accommodation if possible over and above what may be departmentally constructed through Shri A.C.Roy, Principal, Bengal Engineering College, and to take such steps as may be necessary to expedite the construction programme of the University.

The Vice-Chancellor should report progress of work to the Chancellor and the University in due course.

The meeting then concluded, with a vote of thanks to the Chancellor.

Condolence Resolution

This meeting of the University of North Bengal places on record its deep sense of loss at the sad and sudden death of Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy, B.A., M.D., D.Sc., M.R.C.P.(Lond.) F.R.C.S., (England) F.S.M.Z., (Bengal), Bharat Ratna, Chief Minister of West Bengal, an eminent physician, a great administrator, a profound scholar, a distinguished educationist, and a valiant fighter in the struggle for India's independence. Dr. Roy's influence had been felt for nearly half a century in every sphere of the life of this country. During the last fourteen years of his life when he was Chief Minister of West Bengal his personality dominated the affairs of the State in every department. Many of the well-known institutions in this State which have grown up during the last fifty years owe their existence to his tireless efforts. His loss has been felt by every person, high and low, and by every organisation which looked up to him for guidance. The tragedy has been, however, most keenly felt by this University as he was its architect. This University will ever remember the keen interest which he took in the establishment of the University and the affectionate care with which he planned every detail. By his death this University has suffered an irreparable loss.

This meeting of the University conveys the deepest condolences to the members of the bereaved family.

Condolence Resolution.

This University mourns the death of Dr. Rajendra Prasad, Bharat Ratna, first President of India, at a time when the country needed him most. In the forefront of India's fight for freedom for nearly thirty years, Dr. Rajendra Prasad passed through immense suffering and hardship. When the goal was attained he was chosen the Head of the Republic and India enjoyed the benefit of his constructive statesmanship, mature wisdom and deep insight. A true follower of Mahatma Gandhi, his genial personality, his sympathy and affection towards all won for him the undying admiration of the entire country. His death has been a severe blow to India.

This meeting of the North Bengal University conveys its deepest condolence to the members of the bereaved family.

VICE-CHANCELLOR'S REPORT.

On 1st June 1962 I took charge of office & on 5th June the first meeting of the North Bengal University was held at Raj Bhavan, Darjeeling. In the middle of June, the Architects came to the site and took preliminary steps to start upon their work. On 1st July Dr. H.C. Roy passed away casting a gloom all over. After about a fortnight a notification was made by State Government bringing the North Bengal Colleges under this University. In August, I found the Engineers of the Construction Board waiting for the plans. It appeared that no work was possible since the main buildings in the campus would not be taken up without the Architect's plans. I took upon myself the preliminary work of starting chowkidar's quarters and other essential roads etc. The work was being carried on for only a few days under my direction, when I found the Construction Board coming to my rescue and taking up the work. So in the course of three months, I got accommodation of 12 houses under the 'Low cost housing scheme' from Principal A.C.Roy though not in a completed condition. I also got from him one tube well almost complete. After about one and a half months, all the 13 low cost houses were completed and I got additional 20 flats (small and big) almost ready from the Construction Board. On 28th October we occupied as many rooms as were available but on 1st November 1962 Military authorities badly needed them and occupied them with your permission. The University had to shift to the town — thanks to the Siliguri College Authorities — they vacated a Hostel for us where we have accommodated classes. The rooms are all 14 x 12 ft. which means we could admit only between 12 to 14 boys

For...
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for the Post Graduate, Arts and Science Departments. There is one big hall which is being utilised for Physics Laboratory. We rented some houses for office and stores and some for teachers quarters. As accommodation was not available, no Chemistry department could be started but very recently I have appointed a Reader who is engaged in working out the details so that the Gas Plant can be properly located and Laboratories can be organised towards the beginning of the next session.

After giving a start to building constructions in the Western corner of our area, I took up the academic side. It was felt by me, on the information available, that the urgent need in this region was development of science study. The region of North Bengal can easily claim a number of good students who for want of facilities in the Colleges are not able to continue their studies either for Honours or for Post Graduate studies. Most of the residents of this area are poor and organisation of science studies has not been possible due to various reasons. I therefore started with science subjects Mathematics, Physics, Zoology, Botany and Geography etc. Within a few days I discovered that while for Chemistry department majority of appliances and apparatus needed would be available in India, apparatus and appliances required for Physics department, which should be of very superior quality, made in European countries, were getting more and more scarce in the Indian market. I therefore organised Physics Department first. Since accommodation was not available I postponed the opening of Chemistry department till the next year and began to organise Physics and Mathematics Departments specially.
Thus...

Thus, on the whole, I have in the University, the following departments functioning :-

Mathematics, Physics, Geography,
Botany, Zoology, English, Economics,
Political Science and International
Relations.

There has been a great pressure on me from the public for opening classes in History, Bengali, Commerce, Sanskrit etc. I have been seriously thinking about them and about one subject I have decided and that is Bengali which is so repeatedly being stressed for any University in Bengal. I set up a Selection Committee and they have selected a first-rate man whose name will have received your consideration by now. It is also my desire that Commerce studies should be started since the subject is popular and very strong pressure has been brought on me. These two subjects Bengali and Commerce will not be expensive but will be received with enthusiasm by the public. It is also my wish that with the special help of Principal A.C. Roy, Automobile Engineering may be started at Siliguri, since Siliguri is an important centre for this branch of Engineering and transport has acquired a special importance. I have also a very strong desire to take full advantage of the existence of the Institute of Pharmacy in Jalpaiguri and start the degree of B.Pharm. I had a talk with the Director of Health Services and I propose to collect further details. The matter which is engaging my most serious attention is to start B.A., B.Sc. Honours Classes without which local materials will not be available for post graduate studies and research. This region can obtain the benefit only when honours classes are started. It is also important to think as to how quickly I can open post graduate and honours classes in Geology.

Let...

Let me put before you the most serious difficulty that I had to pass through in the matter of employment of teachers for this University. I found a very strong prejudice against this region as a place of wilderness - bad climate - without amenities and in short a very backward region. At a particular time I despaired - specially when the Principals of Colleges gave me a depressing picture. I then met a large number of eminent Professors in Calcutta and placed my requirements before them for the right type of men required for a new University. It was through their persuasion and my assurances that I could make some headway. As I could not offer them houses, my case became very weak. However, once I got them for interview, the first thing that I had to see was that these teachers possess requisite qualifications in their subjects - for this I took the private opinions of several experts before I actually convened the Selection Committees. The second most important thing was to see that these men could stick to their posts and not leave the University after a month or so - that would create a scare against the University and would baffle all our efforts subsequently made. The Selection Committees were particular about the qualifications and experiences and research papers of those who wanted to become Professors but in the case of Lecturers they wanted to find out the potentiality, their personality and their ability of expression. In short, I can assure you that every effort has been made to make really good appointments. To be candid, considering the situation, I feel proud of the selections.

Hardly did I complete these arrangements when I was confronted with the very elaborate task of paper-setting and moderating in respect of L.A., I.Sc., B.A., B.Sc. (old courses) - honours and pass ; B.A., B.Sc. (3 years' course) - pass and honours and in September next M.A. and M.Sc. Part I. I hope you will

be

be interested to know that the University had to arrange for about 350 paper setters of high reputation, about 80 moderators who enjoyed the reputation of being not only sound and sober but also patient and experienced. I had to fix up more than 500 examiners. The total number of candidates would be over 7000 and distributed in 10 centres which, as you know, are badly connected. In this connection, I may also state that the printing of these papers, under ^{security}/measures, is a stupendous work which one can hardly describe. Bengal Govt. Press refused. Calcutta University Press was fully busy and there are very few Presses in India which would take up this work and when they take up this work they want at least seven to eight months' previous initiation. I had to get the printing done in 2 months and according to security and secrecy requirements I alone must do the work — nobody else can know it. I am however glad to inform you here that so far I.A., I.Sc., examinations and B.A., B.Sc., examinations old course and 3 years B.A., B.Sc., examinations in honours have been completed, without any hitch or any trouble. The rest of the examinations will include 3 year B.A. pass examinations, B.T. examinations and B.B. examinations. Upto yesterday I was immersed in this work and on return from here I shall go through another 60/70 question papers from proof correcting to printing. I hope that these examinations too will be conducted smoothly.

Within a few days I shall start making preparations for the next session. Apart from getting courses and studies ready, I shall have to arrange for accommodation which I have to provide during the next session to more than 1000 boys who will seek admission. It is not any more possible for me to say that rooms are small and admission will be severely restricted — that will make the students and the public hostile to the

University...

University and once the Institution becomes unpopular, nobody will be able to help the University. I have, therefore, always sought your help and you, in your sympathies, have always extended your utmost consideration for its development and have given me the permission to make houses as fast as possible with the locally available materials. In this connection, I shall also express my appreciation for the help that I have received from time to time from the Education Secretary and the Finance Secretary in as much as they have sanctioned as large an amount as they could do under the financial stringency through which the State Governments are passing. I still hope that some more money would be available which will help me out of this peculiar situation in which the University has been placed due to lack of a home - Class Rooms, Libraries, Laboratories, Boys' Hostel, Girls' Hostel, Hospital, Play Grounds, Union Hall etc. I may mention here that I have started constructing in the eastern segment a few buildings which will go a long way to solve our accommodation problems at least for the time being.

The Special Officer whom you sanctioned, as a special case, has been going through his task of constitution making and I may state that satisfactory progress has been made already. He has other duties also - he has to look after the financial grants which are received from the U.G.C. and distributed to various Institutions affiliated to the University. This work was in arrears for so many years and our College teachers' cases began to cause annoyance to the U.G.C. The Special Officer has by now almost cleaned up the files. In addition to this, he has to look after the complexities and details of conduct of the examinations and for this work no body is more competent than our Special Officer who was formerly the Controller of Examinations of the Calcutta University. It is with his help and also with the help
of

of the Assistant Controller of Examinations, with his staff and also the Principals of the affiliated Colleges and the Principal, Bengal Engineering College, that the examinations are proceeding smoothly.

Since you have entrusted me with the organisation of the North Bengal University I have taken it up as a religious duty and at times in my hectic moments, I might have overlooked some provisions of the rules - for this I crave your indulgence. If I have to build, it must be built quickly as you have warned me that delay is dangerous. It has to be built with thoroughness and with a far sighted vision. Teachers and students must live in harmony on rich intellectual plane and many things I have to do which may not be fully covered by Rules and Regulations - I crave your indulgence here too. I shall not stop until the University is equipped with a good Library and good Laboratories and until the grievances of North Bengal are fully removed, and in this task of mine I have not the slightest doubt that I shall enjoy your sympathy and sympathies of the body to which I have the honour to belong.

The Chancellor, who presided over the meeting, stated* at the outset that while this meeting was the small beginning of what she hoped would ultimately be a big achievement, the importance of the North Bengal University lay in the fact that not only would it provide adequate educational facilities for the people of the northern districts but also on the psychological effect that it would have on all those who had hitherto felt - perhaps with a certain amount of justification - that they have been not only very much isolated from the rest of the State during recent years but also neglected. Wherever the Chancellor had toured in the North Bengal, she found that feeling among all sections of the people and she hoped they would now feel that this University was going to be a centre for the education of their children and, what was more important, was going to open fresh avenues of employment in the future.

The entire area of North Bengal comprising the districts of Malda, West Dinajpur, Jalpaiguri, Cooch Behar and Darjeeling were vulnerable from the political point of view. In addition to Pakistan, there were Bhutan and Sikkim and Nepal which bordered on Tibet and China. The Chancellor, therefore, felt strongly that this area should be developed from the politically, socially, economically and from educational points of view.

The Chancellor mentioned that when she last met Father Stanford of St. Joseph's, he sought her advice as to the reply he should send to letters still being received by him from parents of students expressing their anxiety on account of the presence of the Chinese on our border,

*Summary of the speech.

The Chancellor suggested to Father Standfort that he should inform the anxious parents that there obviously could be no cause for panic when the Government of West Bengal was spending vast sums on setting up a new University in North Bengal. Even the announcement of the Government's intention to set up this University had itself brought about a new atmosphere of hope and confidence among the people of this area.

The Chancellor sounded a note of caution with regard to the architecture, buildings, equipment, furniture etc. of the new University. She had noticed a tendency to import not only workmen but also materials from outside when any new institution was being built. It would be a serious mistake if this policy was adopted here. It was essentially necessary, the Chancellor stressed, that as far as practicable, the task of building the University should be entrusted to the people of this area. The people of each district of North Bengal should be made to feel that this would be an institution of their own that would ultimately change the face of North Bengal.

The Chancellor confessed that she was almost fanatical about utilising local talent and resources. She pointed out that local timber was plentiful, beautiful textiles were made by the Kalimpong Arts and crafts, the Tibetan carpenters were very efficient and there was no dearth of good artisans and masons in this area. Due to the stoppage of trade between India and Tibet, there was widespread unemployment in Kalimpong. Large number of cobblers, tailors, workers of wool godowns, muleteers had been thrown out of employment following the stoppage of Indo-Tibetan trade. The Government of West Bengal had decided to implement a number of schemes in order to utilise local resources and also to provide work to this large number of unemployed people. It was unwise to keep so many people unemployed and dissatisfied.

* The Chancellor explained that in the context of what she had stated steps might be taken to give a concrete shape to the new University. Things would have to be rushed through because delay was dangerous. If necessary, the Chancellor suggested, routine formalities might be waived while the buildings were in the process of construction. The Chancellor once again referred to the architecture of the buildings of the University which should not only be attractive but should also

also reflect the different styles of architecture in vogue in this regions. The Chancellor pointed out that steps should be taken to prepare the layout for the planting of trees on the campus.

The Vice-Chancellor then thanked the Chancellor for her opening speech, which he thought would be extremely valuable in the development of the new University.

At the suggestion of the Chancellor it was also resolved that the Vice-Chancellor be authorised to rent suitable accommodation if possible over and above what may be departmentally constructed through Shri A.C.Roy, Principal, Bengal Engineering College, and to take such steps as may be necessary to expedite the construction programme of the University.

The Vice-Chancellor should report progress of work to the Chancellor and the University in due course.

The meeting then concluded, with a vote of thanks to the Chancellor.

1. The proceedings of the meeting held on 22nd April, 1963



A BRIEF PRCISE OF THE CASE OF PROF.M.DUTTA FOR DEPUTATION LEAVE.

Name :- Prof. M.Dutta.

Present Post :- Professor and Head of the Departments of Mathematics & Statistics of the University of North Bengal.

Leave applied for :- Deputation leave for 5 months with full pay.

Date of submission of application:- 23.12.62.

Purpose:- (i) To visit the University and the Institute of Theoretical Physics of Rostock, East Germany for exchanging of ideas with the active scientists and to deliver two courses of lectures on invitation. (ii) To visit the Max-Planck Institute of Göttingen, West Germany for exchanging of ideas with the active centres of advanced studies and researches.

Topic of lectures :- (i) Statistical Physics (foundations),
(ii) Abstract spaces.

Nature of invitation :- Invitation from the Theoretical Institute of Rostock University is for 6 months and the D.D.R. has handed over IM 3000/- to the institute to meet all the expenses of my tour in East Germany. An informal invitation was received in August, 1962, and formal invitation was received in November, 1962 and was accepted in December 1962 after the direction of the Vice-Chancellor. On receiving the invitation Prof. M.Dutta had a talk with the ... , ... Vice-Chancellor, and enquired whether this offer should be declined or at least postponed at present or not. The Vice-Chancellor told that as this invitation would be considered a great honour for the newly created University, the invitation should be accepted and the University would surely and gladly grant a deputation leave for 5/6 months.

Expenditure in the tour:- The Hotel charge per night in West Germany is only IM 10/-. In East Germany, it is much cheaper. So the amount of IM 1000/- in West Germany and IM 3000/- in East Germany is quite enough for meeting all my expenses in Germany. There will be no difficulty of foreign exchange in the present tour.

Passage:- The Governor of West Bengal has kindly sanctioned Rs.2000/- to meet the passage expenses. The rest will be borne by Prof. M.Dutta if no grant is obtained from other sources. Journey both ways will be booked from India.

When the Leave will be availed of :- From the middle of November or from the February (in the opinion of the Vice-Chancellor, the latter will be more convenient).

Additional Remarks :- As the invitations extended by foreign Universities, Institutes (and Government) were accepted and the matters were announced in academic matter, it is not simply a personal case and in it, prestige of the University and our nation is also involved. Works of the Department can be arranged so that there will not be of much difficulty during the period of Prof. Dutta's absence.

Every Professor or Reader shall be appointed by the Executive Council on the recommendation of a Selection Committee which shall be constituted as follows :-

- (i) The Vice-Chancellor, who shall be the Chairman of the Committee ;
- (ii) The Dean of the Faculty concerned, if any ;
- (iii) A person to be nominated by the Chancellor, not being a member of any of the subordinate authorities of the University and having special knowledge of the subject for teaching of which the Professor or Reader is to be appointed.
- (iv) A person to be appointed by the Executive Council not being a member of any of the subordinate authorities of the University and having special knowledge of the subject for teaching of which the Professor or Reader is to be appointed.

Every Senior Lecturer, and every Lecturer shall be appointed by the Executive Council on the recommendation of a Selection Committee which shall be constituted as follows :-

- (i) The Vice-Chancellor, who shall be the Chairman of the Committee ;
- (ii) The Dean of the Faculty concerned, if any ;
- (iii) The Head of the Department concerned ;
- (iv) A person to be nominated by the Chancellor, not being a member of any of the subordinate authorities of the University and having special knowledge of the subject for teaching which the Senior Lecturer or Lecturer is appointed.

1. The proceedings of the meeting of the University held on 11th July, 1963 were confirmed.
2. The shifting of the Botany and the Zoology Departments from Darjeeling to Siliguri was considered.

The Vice-Chancellor suggested that in view of the developments which have arisen round this matter, the Darjeeling Government College be allowed to continue Post-Graduate teaching in Botany and Zoology, while the University College of Science should also develop Post-Graduate study in these subjects at Raja Hammohunpur as already arranged with library and laboratory equipments.

The question was carefully examined in the light of the past decisions and the policy of the State Government in regard to hill areas. As decided in the past by the University, it was agreed that Post-Graduate teaching in Botany and Zoology should continue at Darjeeling Govt. College and if demands from qualified students justify, the question of opening centres in Siliguri would be considered.

College and if demands from qualified students justify, the question of opening centres in Siliguri would be considered.

The Vice-Chancellor, however, was of the opinion that Siliguri would be an equally good centre if not a better centre for the study of these subjects. Because of its position, it will not only attract the hill students but also students from other parts of West Bengal who inspite of their qualifications find it difficult to continue their Post-Graduate studies.

After some further discussions the following resolution was adopted :-

"Post-Graduate teaching in Botany and Zoology should continue at the Darjeeling Government College. The Directorate of Public Instruction may be requested to make the necessary arrangements in this respect. The question of opening new centres of Post-Graduate studies in Botany and Zoology may be considered in due course in the light of actual demand".

4. It was reported by the Vice-Chancellor that Dr. D. P. Roychowdhury, Ph.D., a superannuated officer of the Govt. of India (Central Sericultural Research Institute) had been appointed by the Vice-Chancellor on a temporary basis for a period upto 30th June, 1963; subject to the approval of the Chancellor. The Vice-Chancellor reported that he had extended the services of Dr. Roychowdhury upto the 31st of August, 1963 in anticipation of the approval of the University. The extension recommended by the Vice-Chancellor was agreed to as a special case, and no further extension was considered necessary.

Considering the output of graduates from the North Bengal Colleges, it was agreed that the present demand for Post-Graduate facilities would not be large as graduates with requisite qualifications (with Honours and Distinctions) from North Bengal are not likely to exceed 50 in all subjects. In view of the limited resources available, the University should develop Post-Graduate facilities on a careful survey of the possible output of graduates from

its.....

its various affiliated Colleges. It was also generally agreed that Honours facilities should as far as possible be developed in the various affiliated Colleges. The question of provision of Honours courses by the University has numerous difficulties at the present moment.

Vice-Chancellor pointed out that this was just the beginning of higher education in North Bengal, and many more students would come in as soon as facilities were placed before them. The atmosphere has got to grow. Apart from this, further expansion will also meet the problem of surplus qualified graduates of West Bengal.

It was suggested that a Committee consisting of the Vice-Chancellor, Dr. D.M. Soni, Mr. E.K. Hay and Principal A.C. Roy should go into this question of additional teaching strength and report to the University at an early date.

The Chancellor desired that the next meeting should take place at Raj Bhavan, Calcutta, on 28th August, at 5 P.M. to discuss the additional requirements of University Teaching staff.

Item I. To confirm the minutes of the meetings held on 11th
August, 1963 and the adjourned meeting held on 18th

The proceedings as modified (Annexure I and
Annexure II) were confirmed.

Arising out the minutes, it was agreed that the
Director of Public Instruction should be informed by the
University that Darjeeling Government College have been
recognised as a centre of Post-Graduate teaching in Botany
and Zoology. The Director of Public Instruction may also
be requested to provide the College with requisite
additional teaching staff, additional class rooms,
laboratory accommodation, with necessary equipment and
books and journals. As regards the standard of accommodation,
laboratory facilities, teaching staff, books and equipment,
expert advice would be sought pending the framing of the
statutes and necessary rules and regulations.

The University also agreed that rules should be
framed to prescribe minimum qualification for admission
into Post-Graduate courses of studies. Ordinarily graduates
with Honours or Distinctions should be admitted. Pass
Graduates who have obtained 50% in a particular subject
may also be admitted to the Post-Graduate Courses,
provided the candidates have obtained Second Class in
the Higher Secondary or the Pre-University Examination.

Item No. 2 : To consider the question of fixing the additional strength of teaching staff for the various departments proposed by the Vice-Chancellor.

In regard to the additional teaching staff, the list submitted by the Vice-Chancellor was considered. The University decided to refer the matter to a Committee consisting of Principal A.C.Roy plus one or two experts to be selected by him in consultation with the D.P.I.

The report of the examinations of B. A./B. Sc. Part I (Three Year Degree Course) of 1963 was placed before the

// University. It was noted that the present examinations have been conducted in conformity with the rules of the Calcutta University. It was decided that the Vice-Chancellor and Principal A. C. Roy should be authorised to go through the report and publish results and should be reported to the University.

Item No.4 : To report the schedule of Tuition fees, Session Charges, Hostel Charges fixed for the University student during 1962-63 and to recommend the schedule for 1963-64.

The schedule of rates of tuition fees, session charges hostel etc. (as per Annexure III of the Agenda for the meeting of 7th September, 1963) during 1962-63 which were being charged to the students was approved. It was felt that for the further as far as possible these schedules should be the same as they prevail in other Universities, like Burdwan and Calcutta. It was accordingly agreed that Principal A. C. Roy should examine the conditions of North Bengal and prescribed necessary schedule taking into consideration the standards also prescribed by the Burdwan University for schedule of fees etc. Principal Roy's report should be placed at the next meeting of the University for approval.

Item No.5 : To report the schedule of remuneration fixed for Paper Setters, Moderators, Examiners etc., for different Examinations of 1963 and to recommend the schedule for the same for 1964 Examinations.

The schedule of rates of remuneration for Paper - Setters, Moderators, Examiners etc. (as per Annexure IV of the Agenda for the meetings of 7th September, 1963) for examinations of 1963, was approved. The University resolved that the rates should not be higher than those prevailing in other State Universities. For the present the Burdwan University rate should be adopted.

Item No. 6 : To report the schedule of fees of different University Examinations of 1963 and to recommend the continuance of the same for 1964 examinations.

The schedule of fees of different University examinations of 1963 (as per Annexure V of the Agenda for the meeting of 7th September, 1963) was approved. In regard to fees for different University Examinations for 1964, it was also resolved that the Burdwan University rates should be followed.

Item No. 7 : To place the draft Statutes and Ordinances as prepared by the Special Officer.

The draft Statutes and Ordinances as prepared by the Special Officer were placed before the University. The consideration of the Statutes and Ordinances was postponed to enable Members of the University to go through them individually. A Committee consisting of the Vice-Chancellor, Shri K.E.Ray, Principal A.C. Roy and Dr. D.M.Sen should examine those Statutes, along with the Officer on Special Duty, and place their comments before the next meeting of the University.

Item No. 8 : To consider any other matter with the permission of the Chair.

With the permission of the Chancellor, the following items were discussed and decisions taken :-

(i) The Comptroller and Auditor General of India should be requested to send on deputation an Officer of the corresponding grade to be the Finance Officer of the University. He will be appointed on deputation terms.

(ii) The Chancellor also directed that the Vice-Chancellor should examine how the Post-Graduate Students' Union has been formed without rules and regulations being prescribed by the University.

(iii) The Vice-Chancellor should submit a full report at the next meeting as to under whose authority the Students' Union has been formed and the functioning of the Union since it has been formed.

(iv) The Chancellor also directed that an Officer with suitable teaching and administrative experience should be appointed. He should be in administrative charge of the entire Post-Graduate Teaching like the Secretary to the Post-Graduate Council of the Calcutta University.

The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

- (5) Geographic Field survey and diagnostic survey should be made compulsory for every student of Geography in every stage of training and, therefore, during two years, 15 days in each year should be usefully utilised for this indispensable Geographic branch of studies in the Post-Graduate and in the Honours Courses. On this, Dissertation should be submitted by each and every student for its proper assessment before the final examination, to enable the students to sit for their final examination; for all these, financial provisions should be made to make this scheme a success. For each class Rs. 1,000/- be granted for Geography field survey work during each academic session.
- (6) The prescribed syllabus is approved for the Post-Graduates and Honours classes.
- (7) For the smooth functioning of theoretical and practical classes of the department, the following staff set up is recommended for 1963-1964,
 - (i) Technical Assistant .. 4 only
Artist, Draughtsman,Photographer,

Rules for Medical benefits

i. (A) For students

(i) The consultation with the Medical Officer in the University Health centre will be free of charge between 8 A.M. to 9.30 A.M. except on Sundays and other University Holidays.

(ii) Where Hostel Superintendent considers a case "Emergency case" he will request the Medical Officer to come to the University site at any time of the day. This visit also will be free of charge. The charge for Medicines, however, will be determined as per schedule below.

(B) For employees whose salary does not exceed Rs. 100 p.m.

They will be given the facility as has been allowed to the students in respect of medicines "not chargeable" as per schedule and also in respect of call from Health Centre to patient's quarters. In case of any emergency call between the hours 8 A.M. to 9 P.M. in the day to the Medical Officer, a nominal "visit fee" of Rs. 2 per call will have to be borne by the employee of the above category. If any emergency call is given between 9 P.M. to 6 A.M. then the "visit fee" will be Rs. 4. In both these cases, the amounts are for Siliguri to patient's quarters (Rajarammohunpur).

(C) For employees with salary exceeding Rs. 100 but with less than Rs. 250 p.m.

(i) No medicine will be given free of charge.

(2) For visit at the University Health Centre, no fee charged.

(3) For visits at patient's quarters within the campus within the time as per rule (A)(1), a fee of Rs. 2 shall have to be given to the medical officer for each visit; if the call is between the hours of the day upto 9 P.M., will be Rs. 3; if the call is made between 9 P.M. and such fee will be Rs. 4. In all these cases, the amounts are for Siliguri to patient's quarters (Rajarammohunpur).

(D) For employees with salary exceeding Rs. 250 p.m.

(i) No medicine will be given free of charge.

(2) For visit at the University Health Centre, no fee charged.

(3) Where an employee has given a call to the Medical Officer during the scheduled period, the fee will be Rs. 3. And his scheduled period of duty at the campus or his office (vide Rule (A)(1) above), he will have to pay a "visit fee" of Rs. 4 and if the call is made between 9 P.M. to 6 A.M. such fee will be Rs. 8.



The members present in the meeting also took a serious view and finally recommended that pro rata marks be allotted to candidates for that group of the paper. The Vice-Chancellor was authorised to publish the results as modified.

15. The Vice-Chancellor placed the results of B.A. and B.Sc. Compartmental (Old Course) examinations of 1963. Vice-Chancellor was authorised to publish the results.
16. The Vice-Chancellor placed the results of B.A. and B.Sc. Part II Compartmental Examination, 1963, (Three Year Degree Course). The Vice-Chancellor was authorised to publish the results.

2. On confirmation you will be entitled to the benefits of the University Provident Fund according to its rules then in force. Persons appointed on probation to substantive posts are qualified to subscribe to the Provident Fund but in case their services terminate before confirmation, they will not be entitled to receive any portion of the University contribution or interest accrued thereon.

3. Your appointment is subject to your being physically fit by the Medical Officer/Board appointed by the University.

4. On your confirmation, you will be required to enter into a Service Contract with the University on terms and conditions as may be prescribed by the University and in force as on the date of your confirmation.

6. You will retire at the completion of 60 years of your age. The University may, however, extend the service upto 65 years, if it thinks necessary.

7. Your date of birth will be determined according to the entry of your age in the Matriculation/School Final/Higher Secondary certificate of the University/Board or Date of Birth corroborated by an entry in the Corporation Register. Only the Date of Birth (or age) thus determined on the basis of record in your Matriculation/School Final/Higher Secondary Examination Certificates or in the official Birth Register shall be acceptable by the University. Once a declaration of age has been made by you on that basis, the same shall be binding on you for all times, for all matters relating to superannuation. For verification of age you will have to produce evidence as mentioned above within 3 months from date.

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SUGGESTIONS ON EXAMINATION METHODS
FOR ADOPTION BY THE NORTH BENGAL
UNIVERSITY

In view of widely accepted idea that standards of education in Indian Universities are deteriorating year by year and also that discipline amongst university students at all stages need to be strengthened it is suggested that the rules and regulations governing examinations, teaching methods, assessment of students, etc. may receive very careful consideration of the North Bengal University authorities, particularly since the University is a new one and is, therefore, in a position to formulate new policies on education at the University level.

The outlook on University Education has, over the past 15/20 years, gradually become "commercial" with the result that a university degree is looked upon merely as an essential step for earning reasonably good livelihood. There are many factors which have caused this tendency amongst the younger generation. Most of these factors may be attributed to reasons economic and political. The authorities of the North Bengal University, therefore, need not look into any other aspect except academic, physical and mental educational standards.

The system of assessment in the university examinations automatically determines the method of teaching in colleges and also guides the average student's study methods for success in university examinations.

The University examinations at present are being held at very well-defined levels as follows :

- (a) Pre-University Science and Arts Examinations
- (b) B.A., B.Sc., And B.Com Pass Examinations
- (c) B.A., B.Sc., and B.Com Honours Examinations
- (d) M.A., M.Sc., and M.Com Examinations, and
- (e) Research Degrees.

It is to be noted that in the Pre-University as well as B.A. Pass, B.Sc. and B.Com Pass syllabi the intention is for the students mainly to learn facts and implication of those facts whereas in the

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higher levels, viz. B.A., B.Sc. and B.Com Honours and M.A., M.Sc., and M.Com., the object of the courses is not only fact-finding study but also to encourage depth of study and research.

The bulk of the university students study Pre-University and B.A., B.Sc., and B.Com. Pass Courses. If, therefore, the University Regulations, syllabi of studies and teaching methods are re-modelled with a view to achieving higher standards in the academic and extra-academic field, the purpose of the University would then be well served. The suggestions that follow are, therefore, for these three groups of students only.

It is suggested that the syllabi of studies in Pre-University Arts, Science and Commerce as well as in the Pass B.A., B.Sc., and B.Com. levels should be re-written by experts in the form of questions only. The questions should be so formed that in order to answer these questions a student will have to learn the whole of the present syllabus. The syllabus so framed by questions shall be numbered serially with letter prefixing, if necessary. Internal examinations in College should be introduced by a team of teachers by rotation in each affiliated college where viva-voce examinations in the subjects are to be conducted. A student when ready to take the university examination shall carry with him the assessment in percentage made by the affiliated college authorities. The University examination, both theoretical and practical, shall be conducted as is done now except that there shall be no paper setting as is done now. Instead the examination centres should merely be informed of the serial number of the questions on the syllabus to be announced in the examination hall. The University need not declare any arithmetical percentage for pass in each subject and in the whole examination. Instead the written examination results together with the internal assessment should form the basis on which the student's result is to be declared. This decision should be made by the University on the recommendation of the appropriate academic bodies of the University.

Comparison between the performance of a student at the University written examinations and at the Internal Examinations at the College

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will show the standard in teaching maintained by the affiliated colleges. The University Inspector of Colleges will then have data on which to base his advise and guidance to the affiliated colleges.

This note is submitted for consideration of the University authorities and is meant for consideration in respect of the Pre-University Arts And Sciences and the B.A. and B.Sc. Pass standards.

- 7(a) The Secretary to the Governor, and the Deputy Commissioner of Darjeeling placed before the meeting the letter of release of the University buildings in the Western Sector bearing the signature of a member of the Engineering staff of the Construction Board (P.W.D.) and also a copy of the Governor's letter to the Military authorities. It was felt that there should be a clarification of the contents of the two letters. After some discussions, the Vice-Chancellor suggested to give a clarification to the Governor.
- (b) The Sylviculturist presented the problems relating to the lay-out programme. It was decided that the Sylviculturist's plans be generally approved and that the detailed programme with the names of trees and their positions in the revised 'Master-Plan' may be placed before Dr. J.C. Sengupta for his suggestions.

It was also agreed that within the amounts sanctioned for 1963-64 and 1964-65, reappropriation is approved as necessary and for making wooden cabins for employees of the Forest Department in charge of the work of gardening etc. in the University Campus.

It was also decided that the Riflerange be shifted to another suitable place.

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8. The Vice-Chancellor reported that at the request of the University Grants Commission the North Bengal University has agreed to organise Summer Institutes extending over a period of 40 days for -

(a) Mathematics for Higher Secondary Teachers
at Darjeeling and

(b) Physics for College Teachers at the University Campus at RajaRammochunpur.

These Institutes will be held under the auspices of North Bengal University as organised by the University Grants Commission in collaboration with the Ministry of Education (Govt. of India) and the U. S. Agency for International Development. All expenses will be borne by the University Grants Commission.

9. Resolved that a Results Committee be constituted consisting of the following members :-

Vice-Chancellor,

Dr. J.C. Sengupta, and
the Controller of Examinations,

to consider and approve the results of the different examinations of the North Bengal University held in 1964. The Committee was authorised to publish the results on behalf of the University as soon as the results are passed by them and to report to the University about the action taken.

10. The joint report of the Vice-Chancellor and Principal A.C.Roy regarding re-orientation of some of the University examinations be placed before a Committee consisting of -

and report to be submitted to the University with the recommendations.

11. The budget for 1964-65 as prepared by the Vice-Chancellor was placed before the meeting and after some discussion the budget was adopted subject to certain modifications indicated by the Finance Secretary, Education Secretary and other members.

12. The Vice-Chancellor reported that a visiting team from University Grants Commission consisting of Dr. P.J. Philip, Jt. Secretary and Dr. V.S. Patankar, Development Officer (Science) visited the University at RajaRammobpur on 24th, 25th and 26th April, 1964.
13. Resolved that a Committee consisting of -

Dr. S.C. Ganguly,

be set up to go into the representations of the students about guest rents in the hostel and about any other connected matter that Vice-Chancellor may place before the Committee, and to report to the University about the action taken.
14. The University noted that a post office under the style of "North Bengal University P.O." has been installed within the Campus and the University desired that another room may be placed at their disposal for starting a telegraph office till such time as the University may be able to offer larger accommodation in a permanent building when the question of rent would be decided by the University.
15. The Vice-Chancellor reported the Statutes, Ordinances, and Regulations, etc. which had been approved by the Committee appointed by the University and stated that the discussion on the new remaining Statutes, Ordinances, etc. will be taken up by the Committee shortly. It was resolved that the Statutes, Ordinances, etc. which had been approved the Committee be adopted. (Appendix 'A') Page -
16. The Vice-Chancellor reported that the following further payments have been made to the West Bengal State Electricity Board, Siliguri for electrification of Western and Eastern Sectors
 - i) L.T. Power supply to Western Sector - Rs.4,850/-
 - ii) security deposit Rs.1,000 (For Eastern Sector) and Rs.400/- (Western Sector).

17. The Vice-Chancellor's action in reserving two seats in the University M.A. classes in English for students from Orissa was approved and it was decided that the admission of such students from Orissa will be guided by the rules of the University regarding minimum qualifications applicable in case of other students.

18. The following resolution was adopted :-

The State Bank of India, Siliguri/Calcutta is hereby informed that Mr. H.P. Bhattacharjee, recently appointed Finance Officer of the North Bengal University, is authorised to operate the accounts of the University.

Mr. H.P. Bhattacharjee, Finance Officer, will carry out the formalities as required by the rules of the State Bank of India.

19. The following resolutions were adopted :-

- (a) The Finance Officer may act as drawing and disbursing Officer in respect of pay/allowances of the Members/Officers/Teachers/Other employees of the University so to be drawn in accordance with the terms and conditions of their appointment and subsequent orders issued by the competent authority and also in respect of remuneration to the Examiners/Paper Setters/Moderators, etc. at approved rates.
- (b) For day-to-day contingent expenditure of the University, the Finance Officer may draw Funds to the extent of Rs.1,000/- in each case subject to a maximum of Rs.5,000/- in a month.
- (c) For payment of suppliers' bills and other miscellaneous payments, the Finance Officer may draw and disburse money to the extent of Rs.5,000/- in each case.
- (d) The Finance Officer may be authorised to prescribe the various account forms/registers etc. so as to facilitate the preparation of the Annual Accounts and the Annual Budget Estimates of the University and also to prescribe the forms in which the service records of the Officers/Teachers/Staff of the University should be maintained.

20. The Rules for the Provident Fund as drafted by the Finance Officer of the University and as modified by the Finance Secretary, Govt. of West Bengal were approved.

21. The question of settling rent dues payable by the Military authorities for occupation of the University houses and campus was brought up, and it was decided that the Vice-Chancellor may negotiate with the Army authorities about settling them.
22. The appointment of Sri Phani Bhushan Mitra, M.Sc., as Registrar of North Bengal University was reported.
23. The Vice-Chancellor reported that a second visiting team from the University Grants Commission consisting of Mr. K.L. Joshi, Secretary and Mr. R.K. Chhabra, Deputy Secretary visited the University at RajaPammohunpur on 22nd, 23rd and 24th May, 1964.
24. A committee consisting of -

will visit the University and examine the question of accommodation and report how best it can be utilised keeping in view any new subjects of study in the next session of the University.

Statutes

Relating to

Contributory Provident Fund.

In exercise of the power conferred upon it by sub-section (5) of Section 22 and Section 30 of the North Bengal University Act (West Bengal Act XXVII of 1961), hereinafter in these Statutes referred to as "the Act", the University makes the following Statutes, namely, -----

The Statutes relating to Contributory Provident Fund.

Short title and commencement 1.(1) These Statutes may be called the Statutes

relating to Contributory Provident Fund.

(2) They shall be deemed to be effective from 1st June, 1962.

2. In these Statutes, unless the context otherwise requires-

Interpretation and definitions. (a) Words and expressions used shall be interpreted to have the same meaning as they have in the Act or the Provident Funds Act, 1925. (India Act 19 of 1925);

(b) (i) "Accumulated amount" means the amount standing to the credit of a subscriber in his account in the Funds and includes all contributions and interest accrued to such account;

(ii) "Employee" means any officer (including the Vice-Chancellor), teacher or other person who is employed whole-time by the University and is paid from the University Fund.

(iii) "Family" means and includes the following relatives of a subscriber :-

(1) Wife, (2) husband (3) parent, (4) child, (5) minor brother, (6) unmarried sister, (7) widowed sister, (8) a deceased son's widow, (9) a grand child and (10) if the subscriber's father is not alive, a paternal grand parent;

(iv) "Form" means a form prescribed by, and included in the Appendix to, these Statutes;

(v) "Fund" means the Contributory Provident Fund constituted under these Statutes;

(vi) "Leave" means any leave granted under the University Leave Rules except casual leave;

(vii) "Subscriber" means an employee who is required to subscribe to the Fund under these Statutes;

(viii) "Subscription" means the amount which a subscriber is required or allowed by these Statutes to pay to the fund; and

(ix) "Year" means a period of twelve months beginning on the first day of June.

Constitution 2. The University shall constitute a Contributory
of Contributory Provident Fund for the benefit of its employees.
Provident Fund

Right to
subscribe
to the Fund.

4. (1) Subject to the provisions of Statute No.5 of
these Statutes, every employee of the University
shall have a right to subscribe to the Fund in
accordance with these Statutes;

Provided that unless there is a specific provision
to the contrary contained in the terms of the contract
of his service or in the governing Statutes, no
employee shall have a right to subscribe to the
Fund if he has been appointed to the post he holds,
for a term not exceeding one year and was not a
subscriber before such appointment.

Provided further that a person appointed on probation
may subscribe to the Contributory Provident Fund
from the date of his appointment and that on confir-
mation, the University shall add its contribution with
retrospective effect.

(2) If an employee was originally appointed for a
term of one year or less and such term is subsequently
extended so that his total term exceeds one year, he
shall be given the option of subscribing to the Fund
from the date of his original appointment and of pay-
ing the arrear subscription due on the date of his
becoming a subscriber in such monthly instalments as
the Finance Officer may decide. In such a case the
University shall pay its arrear contribution in respect
of such employee in similar monthly instalments.

(3) Every employee who has a right to subscribe to
the Fund under this Statute shall be required to
subscribe thereto.

Employees not 5. No employee shall have a right to the benefits of

of the Fund. the Provident Fund if his services under the University
entitle him to a pension or gratuity or if the Uni-
versity contributes towards a pension or gratuity on his
account.

Administration 6. Subject to the control of the University, the
and management
of the Fund. administration and management of the Fund shall vest
in the Executive Council which may, from time to time,
make such Rules or issue such general or special
directions as may be consistent with these Statutes
for the proper administration and management of the
Fund or for defining the duties and the privileges of
the subscribers. The Executive Council may, at its
discretion, vary or cancel any such Rule or Direction
at any time.

Declaration 7. (1) Every subscriber shall sign a written declaration
and nomination
by subscribers. in Form No.1(P.F.) to the effect that he has read
these Statutes and the Rules made thereunder and
agrees to bind himself and his nominees, heirs and
representatives to abide by the provisions thereof.

He shall also complete and file with the Finance Officer his nomination in Form No.2 (P.F.) or 2A (P.F.) as may be appropriate in each case, after entering therein the name or names of the person or persons to whom in the event of his death he wishes the accumulated account in respect of his account in the Fund to be paid. Every such nomination shall be signed by the subscriber in the presence of two witnesses who shall certify that the subscriber has signed in their presence.

(2) No subscription shall be realised, nor shall any contribution be paid until the requirements of paragraph (1) have been complied with by the subscriber.

Such subscription shall be deducted from his pay/leave salary when he draws the same and credited to his account in the Fund.

(2) A subscriber may be allowed to subscribe to the Fund at a rate higher than 8.1/3 percent. If he wishes to do so;

Provided that any such higher rate shall not be allowed to be varied until he has paid subscription at such higher rate for six months at least.

(3) The University shall contribute to the credit of the account of each subscriber a sum equal to 8.1/3 percent of all pay/leave salary drawn by him from the University Fund. Such contribution shall be made at the time when the subscription payable by the subscriber is deducted from his pay/leave salary. The amount of contribution shall not be affected by any option made by the subscriber under paragraph (2). |

(4) If a subscriber is on leave without pay, no subscription or contribution shall be payable for the period of such leave.

(5) The amount of subscription or contribution to be paid in any one instalment shall be rounded off to the nearest rupee.

Explanation : For the purpose of this Statute, the pay/leave salary of a subscriber shall be deemed to exclude any compensatory allowance which may be drawn by him.

- Investment of the Fund.
13. (1) All amounts accruing to the Fund shall be paid into a Savings Bank Account opened for the purpose with the nearest Branch of the State Bank of India. Any cash balance of the Fund in excess of Rs.5,000 shall ordinarily be invested in National Savings Certificates or National Plan Certificates or loans of the Central or the State Government or in Treasury or similar other bonds which can be redeemed at par at any time; or may be invested in fixed deposits with the nearest Branch of the State Bank of India, so as to yield the maximum rate of interest available for such deposits.

(2) Every Bank account, deposit or investment, made under this Statute shall be maintained or made in the name of the University.

- Interest.
14. (1) All interest that accrues to the Fund shall be the property of the University and in return the University shall guarantee to every subscriber a minimum interest of 3½ percent per annum. Such interest shall be calculated on the monthly closing balance at the credit of the account of the subscriber in the preceding month. After the end of May, every year, the interest which accrued during the preceding twelve months shall be credited to the account of each subscriber;

Provided that no interest shall accrue on the accumulated amount after the expiry of six months from the date on which the final payment becomes due under Statutes No.19 and 20.

(2) If the financial position of the Fund so justifies, the rate of interest referred to in paragraph (1) may be enhanced by the Executive Council at its discretion in respect of any period.

- Finance Officer to operate accounts, etc.
15. Subject to the directions, if any, of the Executive Council, the Finance Officer shall operate on behalf of the University all accounts, deposits and investments made under Statute No.12 of these Statutes and shall have power to do all such things as may be necessary for this purpose.

- Personal Ledger Account of Subscriber.
16. (1) The Finance Officer shall maintain a Personal Ledger Account in Form No.2 (P.F.) in respect of each subscriber and all subscriptions and contributions made and all interest accrued to the credit of the account of the subscriber as also all withdrawals made therefrom shall be entered in such Personal

Ledger Account.

(2) A statement of the accumulated amount in the account of each subscriber shall be furnished to him once a year.

If the subscriber wishes to point out any mistake or discrepancy in the statement so furnished, he shall send an objection in writing to the Finance Officer within one month from the date of issue of the statement. If no such objection is received, the statement shall be deemed to have been accepted as correct by the subscriber.

- Account of the Fund. 17. The Finance Officer shall maintain an account showing all receipts to and disbursements from the Fund and such account shall be audited once a year in such manner as the Executive Council may decide.
- Advances from the Fund. 18. (1) No final withdrawal of the accumulated amount shall be allowed until a subscriber quits his services in the University or dies, whichever is earlier.
- (2) The Vice-Chancellor may sanction an advance to a subscriber from the accumulated amount in the account of the subscriber subject to the following conditions :-
- (a) if the subscriber desires to quit the service;
 - (b) there is no unpaid balance of any previous advance or interest thereon outstanding against the subscriber; and
 - (c) if any of the following events occur :-
 - (i) the total amount of the advances does not exceed three months' pay of the subscriber or one-third of the total of his subscriptions and the interest accrued thereon, whichever is less;
 - (ii) interest shall be charged at the rate of 8 percent per annum on the monthly balance of the advance; and
 - (iii) the purpose of the advance shall be to meet expenses in connection with any one of the following events :-
 - (i) death or sudden disappearance of the subscriber;
 - (ii) illness of the subscriber or a member of his family, other than himself;
 - (iii) daughter's marriage, or
 - (iv) funeral and other ceremonies which, by the religion of the subscriber, are obligatory upon him to perform; or
 - (v) the legal claims of the subscriber does not exceed;
 - (vi) building a house, or a plot of land for the same, or any other satisfactory reason which is not repugnant to the provisions of the Provident Fund Act, 1925, or the rules made thereunder;
 - (3) The Vice-Chancellor may, in a case of urgent necessity and on the recommendation of the Finance Officer, allow a subscriber a further advance or advances from the fund although any part of a previous advance or interest thereon may be
 - (4) interest on the advances to be paid by the Fund.

(5) deductive of deduction.

outstanding provided that the total amount due from the subscriber in respect of all such advances shall at no time exceed three-fourths of the total of the subscriptions paid by the subscriber and the interest accrued therein.

(4) Every application for an advance from the Fund shall be made in Form No.4 (P.F.)

(5) An advance shall be recovered from the subscriber in such number of equal monthly instalments as the Vice-Chancellor may direct;

Provided that such number shall not be less than twelve unless the subscriber so elects, or, in any case more than twenty four. A subscriber may, at his option, repay more than one instalment in any month. An instalment shall not include any fraction of a rupee, the amount of the advance being suitably adjusted, if necessary, to ensure this.

(6) Recovery of an advance shall commence on the first occasion after the advance is made on which the subscriber draws pay for a full month. Recovery shall not be made except with the subscriber's consent while he is on leave or in receipt of a subsistence grant.

(7) Interest on an advance shall ordinarily be recovered in one instalment in the month after which the principal has been fully repaid; but if the period of recovery of advance exceeds twelve months, the interest may, if the subscriber so desires, be recovered in two equal monthly instalments. Every instalment of recovery of interest shall be rounded off to the nearest rupee.

(8) If the account of any subscriber does not carry any interest no interest shall be recovered for any advances made to him.

(9) Recoveries of advances and interest made under this Statute shall be credited as they are made to the subscriber's account in the Fund.

(10) If the Vice-Chancellor applies for an advance from the accumulated amount in his account the sanctioning authority shall be the Executive Council, which shall also decide every other question relating to such advance.

Final payment¹⁹ of Provident Fund to subscriber.

(1) Every subscriber on his retirement shall be entitled to receive the accumulated amount in his account calculated up to the date of his retirement subject to the right of the Executive Council to deduct therefrom any sum referred to in Statute No. 22 of these Statutes provided that the total sum so deducted shall not exceed the total of all contributions made by the University to the account and of any interest accrued thereon.

(2) In this Statute "retirement" means include :

(a) Final retirement after attaining the age of retirement, or

Contd.

- (b) resignation after completion of not less than two years' continuous service in the University, or
 - (c) termination of appointment due to abolition of the post, or to expiry of the term of the contract of service, or
 - (d) retirement on medical grounds.
- (3) If a subscriber resigns before the completion of two years' continuous service he shall be entitled to receive the amount of his own subscription and the interest accrued thereon but shall not be entitled to receive the contributions made by the University and the interest accrued thereon unless the University decides otherwise on the recommendation of the Vice-Chancellor. All contributions and interest thereon shall in such a case revert to the University Fund.
- (4) In the event of the dismissal of a subscriber on account of misconduct or gross negligence of duty, he shall be entitled to receive only the amount of his own subscriptions and the interest accrued thereon while all contributions made by the University and the interest accrued thereon shall revert to the University Fund.
- (5) Every application for final withdrawal of the accumulated amount at the credit of a subscriber shall be made in form No.5 (P.F.)

Final payment 20.
on subscriber's
death,

- (1) On the death of a subscriber the claims for final withdrawal of the accumulated amount in his account shall, subject to the provisions of Statutes Nos.10 and 22 of these statutes, be paid in accordance with the terms of the subscriber's nomination to his nominees or nominees surviving on the date of his death or to their legal representatives.
- (2) If any of the nominees of the subscriber has pre-deceased him, the whole of the amount which would have been payable to such nominee had he been surviving on the date of the death of the subscriber shall, subject to the provisions of Statutes No.10 of these Statutes, be paid to such other person (referred to hereafter as a substitute nominee), if any on whom the right to receive such payment has been conferred in accordance with provis. to sub-section (1) of Section 5 of the Provident Funds Act, 1925.
- (3) If there are no nominees or substitute nominees surviving at the time of the death of the subscriber, the accumulated amount shall be paid to the subscriber's legal representative or such other person or persons as may be declared by a competent Civil Court to be entitled to receive the same, provided that if the amount does not exceed Rs.500, it may be paid to such person or persons as the Executive Council may consider to be the proper person or persons to receive the same.

Contd.....

- Assignments and encumbrances. 21. Subject to the provisions of the Provident Fund Act, 1925, the University shall not be bound by, or recognize, any assignment or encumbrance executed or attempted to be created which affects the disposal of the accumulated amount in accordance with these Statutes.
- Charge on contribution and interest thordon. 22. Notwithstanding any other provisions contained in these Statutes, the University shall have the first charge upon all contributions made by the University in respect of a subscriber and the interest accrued thereon for his debts and other liabilities to the University. The University shall have the right to reimburse itself out of such contributions and interest for such debts and liabilities at the time the accumulated amount is finally paid to the subscriber, his nominees or any other person.
- Question relating to interpretation. 23. Subject to the provisions of the Provident Funds Act, 1925, every question arising in respect of the interpretation of these Statutes shall be decided by the Executive Council whose decision shall be final.
- Statutes binding on subscribers, nominees, etc. 24. All subscribers to the Fund and their nominees, heirs and legal representatives shall be bound by the provisions of these Statutes and the Rules made or directions issued, if any, under Statute No.6 of these Statutes as amended or revised from time to time.

Constitution
Objects and Functions

PART -A

The Association is intended to serve as an organisation for fostering and developing all extra-curricular activities of the students [REDACTED] of the University through two main sections, viz. "Cultural and Social Section" and "Sports and Athletic Section".

2. The Vice-Chancellor shall be the Rector of the Association. The Rector shall (a) nominate a senior member of the academic staff of the University as the "President" of the Association for a period of one year; (b) nominate other officers for a period of one year on Committees and Sub-Committees as provided in the rules given below; (c) nominate for a term of two years not more than three members of the staff to serve on an Audit Board, on which the Audit and Accounts Officer of the University (or any person nominated by the Finance Officer) shall be a member of the Audit Board of the Association; (d) approve the budget estimates (to be submitted before May 15 each year); (e) have powers to sanction any expenditure in the interest of the University; (f) take all other steps for smooth running of the Association; (g) give, when required, clarification of these rules after consulting with the President; (h) have the power, in exceptional circumstances, to dissolve the Committees and Sub-Committees of the Association and order fresh election or to have the affairs of the Association conducted through any organisation he may set up for the purpose for a limited period.
3. Flag of Association:— The Association Flag shall be of the following description:
4. Magazine:— The name of the Magazine to be published by the Association shall be "
5. Motto:— The motto of the Association shall be "
6. Crest:— The crest of the Association shall have the inscription "
7. Uniform:— Specially for Association members:
 - (a) Sports:— Blue with University crest and white shorts.
 - (b) Common Dress:— White trousers, Blue Blazer with crest and University tie (to be determined by the Association),
or
White trousers and Jodhpuri coat (cream).

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PART-B

RULES GOVERNING MANAGEMENT OF THE UNIVERSITY

STUDENTS' ASSOCIATION

5. Membership and the General Body:- Post-Graduate students and research scholars of the University who will join the Association as members of the Association shall collectively constitute the General Body of the Association.
9. President and his Functions:- The President shall normally preside over all meetings of the General Body Committees.
10. The President shall ensure that the accounts of all receipts and expenditure of the Association Fund are properly maintained by the Treasurer in accordance with the Rules as laid down in Part - C.
11. The President shall have powers to dissolve any sub-committee in case of emergency and conduct for a limited period the affairs of the sub-committee through any organisation he may consider necessary.
12. The President shall be responsible for keeping inventory of all sports and other accessories.
13. The President shall have full disciplinary control over all employees of the Association.
14. Eligibility to stand for election of office bearers:- Such students only will be eligible for standing for election as are not in arrears for more than one month in respect of tuition fees and Hostel fees on the first day of the same month in which election takes place.
Mode of election:
15. All elections shall be by secret ballot.
16. The election of Office Bearers for all Committees and Secretaries of Sub-Committees shall be held early in the academic year ordinarily in the first and second week of August.
17. The President shall order the election of Office Bearers with two weeks' notice.
18. The Election Officer nominated by the President shall receive all nomination papers.
19. The nomination paper shall be signed by the nominee and duly proposed and seconded.
20. No candidate shall contest more than one office.
21. Vice-President:- The Vice-President of the Association shall be a student member of the Association elected by the General Body.
22. The Vice-President shall carry out any function delegated to him by the President.
23. The Vice-President shall preside over meetings of all Sub-Committees.
24. General Secretaries:- There shall be one General Secretary for the Cultural and Social Committee and one General Secretary

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for the Sports and Athletic Committee to be elected by the General Body from amongst the students.

- 25. A Register of the General Body will be prepared as on/^aparticular date which shall be 5 days before the elections start. This Register will be the basis on which elections will take place.
- 26. Treasurer:- The Treasurer shall be responsible for maintaining proper accounts for all receipts and expenditure.
- 27. Co-ordinating Committee:- There shall be a Co-ordinating Committee (a) to co-ordinate the activities of the Cultural and Social Section and the Sports and Athletic Section; (b) to pass the sectional budgets; (c) to convene General Body meetings and (d) take such other steps as this committee may find essential for smooth running of the association. The committee shall consist of:-

The President of the Association

The Vice-President of the Association

The Treasurer of the Association

Two General Secretaries, and

Four nominated members of the nonacademic staff on the two committees,

One of the two General Secretaries will be the Secretary of the Co-ordinating Committee upto the end of December of the year and the other will be the Secretary of the Committee upto the end of the session when the University closes for Summer Vacation. (Secretary for the first half and Secretary for the second half will be determined by a lottery before the President).

- 28. Cultural and Social Committee:- The Committee will (a) take steps to promote cultural and academic interest and maintain cultural heritage through debates, lectures, symposium, Seminars etc; (b) encourage developing useful arts and hobbies; (c) frame Budget on the basis of funds placed at the disposal of the Section keeping in view the budget estimates prepared by the previous committee and place the budget before the co-ordinating committee. The Committee shall consist of:-

The President of the Association,

The Vice-President of the Association,

The Treasurer of the Association,

The General Secretary (Cultural and Social),

Four members elected by the General Body from amongst themselves.

The Secretaries of all Cultural-Social Sub-Committees elected by the General Body.

Two members nominated by the Rector from amongst the nonacademic staff.

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29. Sports and Athletic Committee:- The Committee will (a) take steps to efficiently organise various games and sports etc; (b) take steps to develop amongst the students a sense of brotherly feeling, cooperation and spirit to work in harmony through games and sports; (c) frame Budget on the basis of funds placed at the disposal of the section keeping in view the Budget Estimates prepared by the previous Committee and place the Budget before the Co-ordinating Committee. The Committee shall consist of:-
The President of the Association,
The Vice-President of the Association,
The Treasurer of the Association,
The General Secretary (Sports-Athletics),
The Secretaries of all Sports Sub-Committees elected by the General Body,
Two members nominated by the Rector from amongst the academic staff,
The Physical Instructor (ex-officio member).
30. Sub-Committees of the Cultural-Social Section:- The Cultural-Social Section shall have the following Sub-Committees:-
(a) Association Library, Literary (and magazine publication),
(b) Entertainment,
(c) Photography and Films,
(d) Fine and Applied Arts (including modelling),
(e) Gardening.
31. Each Sub-Committee shall have the following membership:
The Vice-President of the Association,
One student representative from each Hall of Residence,
One student representative from each Faculty,
The General Secretary of the Association (Cultural and Social),
The Secretary to the particular Sub-Committee elected by the General Body.
32. Advisers to the Sub-Committees (Cultural-Sport):- For each of the Sub-Committees referred to above, the President may nominate two or more members of the staff to act as advisers.
33. Sub-Committees of Sports-Athletic:- The Sports and Athletic Section shall have the following Sub-Committees:-
Football
Cricket
Hockey
Tennis
Athletics and Aquatics
Gymnastics
Indoor Games, (*Swimming, Games*)

34. Each Sub-Committee shall have the following membership:-
 - (a) The Vice-President of the Association,
 - (b) The General Secretary,
 - (c) One student representative from each Hall of Residence,
 - (d) One student representative from each Faculty,
 - (e) One of the Physical Instructors to be nominated by the President as member adviser,
 - (f) The Captain of the particular game, and
 - (g) The Secretary of the Sub-Committee elected by the General Body.
35. A Selection Board for each of the following games; Football, Cricket, Hockey, Tennis, Table Tennis and Badminton, shall be constituted by the Sub-Committee as follows:-
 - (a) a member of the academic staff (as Chairman),
 - (b) Vice-President of the Association,
 - (c) Captain of the team,
 - (d) Secretary of the Sub-Committee.
36. The Chairman of each Committee, Sub-Committee or Board shall have a casting vote in case of a tie.

BYE-LAWS.

37. (A) General Body:-(i) The General Body may ordinarily meet twice a year. One of these meetings shall be held at the beginning of the academic year (July/August), unless otherwise prevented. The Rector should be informed.(ii) A notice of seven days shall be given for an ordinary meeting of the General Body.(iii) In case of emergency the President shall call a meeting of the General Body with three days' notice.(iv) The president shall call an extra-ordinary meeting of the General Body, if desired by more than 30 percent of the members of the Body, with two days' notice.(v) Thirty percent of the members shall form the quorum for any meeting of the General Body. In case the meeting falls short of the quorum, the adjourned meeting shall be held ordinarily within seven days and the Budget and other proposals requiring the assent of the General Body shall be treated as passed by the General Body if the twice adjourned meeting fails short of the quorum.(vi) The meeting of the General Body shall be called by the Secretary of the Co-ordinating Committee at the initiative of the President.

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(B) Meetings of Committees

- (i) The Committee shall ordinarily meet once a month.
- (ii) An ordinary meeting of the Committee shall be called by the General Secretary concerned with the consent of the President. There shall be at least 3 days' notice for such meetings.
- (iii) In case of emergency the President shall have the power to call a meeting at one day's notice.
- (iv) Five members of the Committee shall form the quorum for any meeting.

(C) Meetings of Sub-Committees

- (i) A meeting of a Sub-Committee shall be called by the Secretary to the particular Sub-Committee with two days' notice.
- (ii) Three members shall form the quorum of any meeting.

38. The Bye-laws may be added to or amended or removed by the General Body at an ordinary meeting of the General Body or an extra-ordinary meeting of the General Body called expressly for the purpose.
39. Seven days' notice shall be given for any such motion for amending any of the above Bye-laws.
40. Amendments shall be carried by 40 percent of the total membership of the Association.
41. The amendment passed by the General Body shall be incorporated in the Bye-laws after the approval of the Rector.

PART-C

Rules Governing Finance and Budget and Accounts and Audit of the Receipts and Payments of the Association Fund.

42. Finance:- The fund of the Association shall comprise of (a) a portion of sessional fees realised from the students [REDACTED] who will join the Association. (Of the sessional charge of Rs. 15/- paid by each student, Rs. 10/- will be credited to the Association which may be spent ordinarily as indicated below:-
 - (i) for Sports - Rs. 8/-
 - (ii) for Social etc. Rs. 4/-)(b) The contribution by the University of 50% of the total amount credited to the Association account as in (a) above. This contribution is meant mainly for requirements of capital nature. The intention of this contribution is to encourage students' activities in all directions.
43. Bank and the Account
Out of the fees paid by students and scholars and collected centrally, the amount represented by 42 (a) above and the contribution represented by 42 (b) above will be credited to the account of the Association in the name of the "President, University Students' Association" in a branch of the State Bank of India.

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44. The contribution of the University as per 42 (b) may be paid to the Association in instalments.
45. Imprest
Out of the fund as per para 42 above, an imprest of Rs. 100/- for each of the two main sections of the Association, viz., "Cultural and Social Section" and "Sports and Athletics Section" may be held by the Treasurer of the Association for meeting day to day expenses, as may be approved by the President. This imprest should be recouped as and when necessary.
46. Special Drawings:
Under provisions made in the Budget, and with the approval of the President, an advance upto a maximum limit of Rs. 150/- for each of the two main sections of the Association, viz., "Cultural and Social Section" and "Sports and Athletic Section" may be drawn from the Association for meeting expenses of special nature on occasions as may be required by any of the sub-section of the two main sections of the Association. This advance need not be recouped.
47. (a) All purchase of sports gear and other materials required for the Association shall be made with economy keeping quality in view. (b) Purchase of an item costing more than Rs. 50/- shall be made with the approval of the President by calling for limited tenders. (c) For petty purchases not costing more than Rs. 20/- for an item, tender may not be called for. (d) In cases of emergency, the President shall have powers to authorise local purchase of any material, the cost of which does not exceed Rs. 50/- .
48. Subject to provisions made in the Budget to be approved by him, as referred to elsewhere in these Rules, the Rector shall have powers to sanction any expenditure from the Association fund which is beyond the financial powers vested in the President of the Association.
49. Budget:- A detailed estimate of annual receipts and expenditure pertaining to the Association under its different sub-sections shall be drawn up by the outgoing Cultural and Social Committee and the Sports and Athletic Committee well before the commencement of the Academic year to which the Estimate relates. This estimate which is to be known as the Budget Estimate shall be submitted to the Rector for his consideration and approval.
50. No expenditure which is not provided for in the Budget Estimates shall ordinarily be incurred.
51. Accounts:- The accounting year for the Association shall correspond with the Academic year of the University.
52. The University portion of the contribution both for sports and social activities ^{are} payable during a financial year, shall be paid within the financial year and be divided in the same proportion.

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53. The cheques shall be signed by the President of the Association. In special case when the President is absent from station, the Rector may authorise, on the written recommendation of the President, the Vice-President to sign cheques.
54. An Annual statement of account of Receipts and Payments for each of the two main sections of the Association Fund, viz., Cultural and Sports shall be drawn up by the Treasurer and signed by the President of the Association. These statements shall be submitted to the Audit Board.
A small amount should be set apart each year out of the income of the Association as depreciation and reserve fund.
55. Audit:- The annual accounts of the Association shall be audited by the Audit Board as in clause 2. A copy of audit report together with a copy of the annual statement of accounts shall be submitted to the Rector.
56. It will be the responsibility of the President of the Association to settle the audit observations and place before the Audit Board.
^{above}

Rules governing the amendment of the Constitution.

57. For the two months (August and September 1964) the entire constitution (together with bye laws) will remain unalterable except if any inconsistency involves stalemate in the working, in which case, the Rector will take the matter upto the Executive Council for necessary rectification.
58. The Executive Council may amend the constitution (together with bye laws) after two months if it thinks necessary without prejudicing the elections already taken place.

From the following, the principles of fixing rent may be given effect to for the time being until new residential houses are available:

1. According to Govt. rules, rent of a residential building is generally recovered from the occupant at 10% of his pay or standard rent of the building, whichever is less. The above principle of fixation of rent is applicable in cases where the occupant is allotted a residential building (or a complete unit of a building) which has been constructed for an official of his status.

2. The 'U' type buildings in the Eastern and Western Sectors have been constructed for providing residential accommodation to the teachers of the University. I understand that the cost of construction of each flat of U6A, U7A and U8A is about Rs.43,000 Rs.25,000 and Rs.21,000 respectively. On this basis, the standard rent of each flat of U6A, U7A and U8A would work out to Rs.215, Rs.125 and Rs.105 per month respectively. According to the principle enunciated in para 1 above, rent may, therefore, be recovered from the Teachers occupying these flats at 10% of their pay since the standard rent of each of these flat is much more than 10% of their pay.

3. The sixteen continuous houses are not meant for the teaching staff. The cost of each of these houses is stated to be Rs.21,000 approx. and on this basis, the standard rent of each of these houses would be Rs.105 per month.

Due to administrative reasons stated below, in some cases it is not possible at this stage to allot the incomplete 'U' type buildings in the Western Sector to the Teaching Staff.

- (i) These buildings are still incomplete since the construction of 1st floor of these buildings has not yet been made.
- (ii) In some cases, the construction of 1st floor over the ground floor will be undertaken soon. So the occupants of the ground floor will find it difficult to stay in these flats during the construction period.
- (iii) The administrative staff have been housed in some of these buildings. For various reasons in the initial stage of the University, some administrative staff are required to perform their duties in the office at odd hours and their stay in the Western Sector for some time more is necessary in the interest of the University.

In view of the above, it is proposed to allot the sixteen continuous houses also to the teaching Staff provided they are willing to occupy them. In order to obtain their willingness, some concessions have been included in the principles formulated. Ordinarily they would be required to pay rent for occupation of these houses at 10% of their pay which will be much less than the standard rent of Rs.105. But since these houses have not been constructed for the Teachers of their staff, and since some Teachers have been provided with greater accommodation in U7A and U8A flats in the Eastern Sector on payment of rent at 10% of their pay it would be anomalous if the occupants of the continuous houses are also required to pay rent at 10% of their pay for smaller accommodation. The Vice-Chancellor in his circular dated 1.4.64 informed the teachers that they would be required to pay rent at Rs.35 for these houses. In the circumstances stated above, I feel that this concession might be allowed for the present but to give relief

to the

to the teachers drawing less than Rs.350, the rent for these houses may be recovered at 10% of pay of the occupants subject to a maximum of Rs.35 p.m. If this proposal is accepted, it will be necessary in the interest of the University to allot the continuous houses only to those Teachers who are drawing pay at a rate not higher than Rs.400 p.m. i.e. the minimum of the scale of Lecturers and to allot the flats U7A and U8A in the Eastern Sector to those who are drawing more than Rs.400 p.m. so that there may not be any avoidable loss to the University on account of rent. A concrete case is cited below to elucidate the position. If a teacher, who is drawing pay of Rs.550 p.m., is allotted a continuous house he will pay rent at Rs.35 only according to the principle stated above but if he is allotted a flat in (U7A) or (U8A) in the Eastern or Western Sector he will pay rent at Rs.55. Thus in the interest of the University finance the continuous houses may not as far as practicable, be allotted to those Teachers who are drawing pay above Rs.400.

4. In the light of the observations made above, some changes have been made in the existing allotments notified in the V.C.'s circular dated 1.4.54. As there are only two U6A flats (Readers' quarters) in Eastern Sector, the same may be allotted to Prof. S. N. Sen (Professor) and Dr. J. P. Sen Gupta Seniormost Reader others may be allotted a flat in U7A or in U8A houses.

5. Some Administrative staff have been provided with family quarters in the Western Sector either in the incomplete 'U' type buildings or in hollow brick houses. According to the Principle enunciated in para 1 above, rent for occupation of these quarters is to be recovered from the occupants at 10% of their pay since the standard rent of these quarters will be much more than 10% of the pay of the occupants. These quarters were not constructed for them and by improvisations they have been placed for occupants use. Hence rent may be recovered at 8½% of their pay subject to a maximum of Rs.25.

In the remaining cases, one or more than one employee have been allotted a room of a flat/house with a common kitchen and bathroom. Naturally, rent cannot be recovered in these cases from the occupants at 10% of their pay. There is no justification for the realisation of rent at a rate higher than 7% of pay from those who occupy one room each and 5% of pay from those who share one room with another person. The following principles may be adopted for the time being in the matter of allotment of these rooms.

- (i) Those who draw pay at Rs.175 p.m. or more may occupy a single room and pay rent at 7% of their pay, subject to a maximum of Rs.12.50. On this basis, the maximum rent of a three-roomed flat would be Rs.40.50 p.m. on the other hand, if these flats were allotted to Teachers, rent at Rs.10 p.m. only (i.e. 10% of Rs.400) would have been recovered from them.
- (ii) Those who draw pay at a rate lower than that indicated at (i) above, may share a room with another person on payment of rent at 5% of their pay, subject to a maximum of Rs.6.50 (i.e. half of 12.50).

6. The installation of electric fans in the flats/houses will increase the capital cost of the buildings and will be taken into account for the purpose of determining the standard rent. As in all cases (except the three low cost houses allotted to Finance Officer, the Controller of Examinations and the Registrar), the standard rent of the flats/houses is much more than 10% of pay of the occupants, there will not be any increase in the rent recoverable from the occupants even if one or two fans are installed in each flat/house. In other words, the occupants will be required to pay extra electric charge only for the installation of fans. Finance Officer, the Controller and the Registrar will have to pay the extra electric charge as indicated above and also increased rent for the installation of fans the cost of which will be duly taken into account for determining in the standard rent of the houses.

7. No charge for the supply of water to the residence is at present recovered from the occupants. Besides rent of the buildings, the occupants are required to pay charges for the consumption of water and electricity. The University is incurring recurring expenditure for the maintenance of the Pump including pay of the pump operator. With the allotment of all the buildings, the number of inmates in each flat will be much more than what it is at present and naturally the expenditure on the maintenance of the Pump House will increase. The University can, therefore, realise from the occupants reasonable charges for the supply of water. Although it is difficult to assess the actual expenditure on this account, the recovery may be made on the basis of facts and figures given below :-

8. In the light of the above, the allotment of residences to the Teaching and Administrative staff may be made as per statement. The rent and the charges for the supply of water and electricity recoverable from each person has also been indicated in the statement.

9. The case of Grade IV employees who draw only Rs. 60 p.m. and also the drivers, electricians, pump operators, plumbers etc. who are required to work even outside the normal working hours, deserves special consideration. A nominal rent of Rs. 2 p.m. may be recovered from each of them for the occupation of one room of the menials' barracks. In addition, charges for the supply of electricity at Rs. 1 p.m. where applicable, may be recovered from each employee.

* Recovery may be effected at Rs. 1.60 from those who occupy a full flat/house and Rs. 1.00 from those who occupy a portion of a house/flat. The residents of UBI flats in Western Sector (men for the Administrative staff) may pay .20 paise each.

Note :- These houses have been allotted temporarily to the teaching staff for which rent is being realised at 10% of pay of the occupant. If these houses were allotted to the administrative staff drawing pay between Rs.250 and Rs.350, rent would have been realised at 10% of pay of the occupants or standards. There are no administrative staff drawing pay above Rs.350 for which rent at rates mentioned above would have been ordinarily allotted to them. So, there will not be any loss to these houses to the Teaching Staff on realisation of rent at 10% of pay of the occupants or standards to a maximum of Rs.35 per month. There is also a limit of Rs.35 mentioned above. Some Lecturers whom UVA/U2A flats have been allotted are requiring 10% of their pay. So, for smaller accommodation in this category of Teachers cannot reasonably be asked to pay rent at Rs.40/- Hence a deduction of Rs.5 has been allowed.

Travelling Allowance Rules.

When a person, whether he is an employee of the University or not, performs a journey authorised by or is deputed or invited to any place to India by, the Vice-Chancellor or any other officer of the University authorised in that behalf for any work in connection with the affairs of the University, he shall be entitled to be paid travelling allowance from the University funds in accordance with these rules, provided that the University shall have the discretion to alter, amend, relax or rescind any provision of these rules in any particular case.

2. For the purpose of these rules, there shall be three grades as specified below :-

GRADE I.

The first grade shall include the following :-

Category - A

- I. Members of the University and members of the Executive Council including the Vice-Chancellor.
- II. Members of the statutory committee appointed by the University or by any statutory committee, who are not employees of the University.
- III. Members of the statutory authorities, Members of other committees appointed by the University.

Category - B

Teaching and Examining Establishment;

- I. All Professors and Readers and Lecturers of the University.

(Professors include Emeritus Professors, Visiting Professors, Honorary Professors and such other as the University may appoint or recognise).

(Readers include University readers, part-time Readers and such other as the University may appoint or recognise).

(Lecturers include part-time lecturers, honorary Lecturers and such others as the University may appoint or recognise).

- II. Papers setters, examiners and lecturers of the year who are not employees of the University, and,

- III. Principal (including officiating or acting Principal, Associate Principals of the affiliated colleges.

- IV. Teachers of this University drawing pay of Rs.150/- p.m. and above.
- V. Research fellow of this University or of any other scheme attached to or conducted by or vested upon the University, but pay not less than Rs.150/-.

Grade Establishment :

- I. Officials of the University, i.e. Registrar, Deputy Registrar, Asst. Registrar, Controller of Examinations, And Asst. Controller of Examinations, Finance Officer, Deputy Finance Officer, Special Officer, Audit and Accounts Officer, Librarian, Deputy Librarian, of the University or Honorary Librarian
- II. All other employees of the University drawing pay not less than Rs.500/- p.m.
- III. Such other persons as may be specified in each particular case or class of cases by the Executive Council or by the Vice-Chancellor.

GRADE - II.

The second grade shall include all (a) employees of this university who are not included in grade I and whose pay is not less than Rs.126/- p.m.; and (b) such other persons as may be specified in each particular case or class of cases, by the Executive Council or the Vice-Chancellor.

GRADE - III.

The third grade shall include (a) all employees whose salary is less than Rs.125/- p.m. and (b) such other persons as may be specified in each particular case or class of cases by Executive Council or the Vice-Chancellor.

....

3. No travelling allowance shall be admissible in respect of any journey performed by a person within a radius of five miles from the office of his employment or if there is no such office the usual place of his residence or business. In any such case, the actual fare paid for each such journey, if performed by any public conveyance, shall be allowed; provided that in the case of a person included in Grade I, the actual cost of hiring a private conveyance subject to a maximum of Rs.5/- for each trip shall be allowed if there be a previous permission of the Vice-Chancellor to hire such conveyance. In case of a person included in Grade II or Grade III, the hiring of a private conveyance shall not be ordinarily allowed for any such journey but the Vice-Chancellor/ Finance Officer/Registrar/Controller of Examinations or any other University official included in Grade I may allow the same for sufficient reasons in any special case.

4. Members of the University shall have the discretion to perform a journey by Air. He will be allowed for each such journey the actual fare paid plus one-fourth of such fare or Rs.30/- whichever is less to cover incidental charges. No other person shall be entitled to travel by air except with the previous permission of the University or the Vice-Chancellor. If any journey is performed by Air without such permission, it shall be deemed, for the purpose of calculating travelling allowance, to have been performed by Rail, Road, Steamer, as the case may be, and travelling allowance shall be paid accordingly. If however a member of the University travels by train, he will be entitled to what is due to a Grade I Officer vide Schedule A.

(iv) <u>Grade III</u> : ...	(i) Rs.2.50 per day in the case of persons whose pay is Rs.100/- per month or more. (ii) Rs.1.50 per day in the case of persons whose pay is below Rs.100/-. For halts at Delhi or Darjeeling double the rates mentioned at (i) or (ii) in respect of this grade or as the case may be.

Provided that only half the daily allowance at the above rates shall be admissible for the day of arrival and for the day of departure; but if the arrival and departure take place on the same day, no daily allowance shall be admissible for the day. No daily allowance shall also be admissible in respect of any temporary halt necessitating railway, steamer or air connections.

L. A. Rules for Vice-Chancellor.

6. The Vice-Chancellor of the University will be entitled to the following travelling allowance :-

(i) For travelling between Siliguri and Calcutta (or any other places where camp office exists) :-

- (a) If by air, for a single journey actual fare plus Rs.8/- as incidental.
- (b) If by rail for each journey Rs.60/- plus a peon (who will travel by class III railways. No daily allowance is admissible to V.C. if he has his own place of stay, (if he stays in a hotel, the actuals will be paid for not more than 7 days except under special circumstances).
- (c) If by rail, for each journey (by air conditioned) Rs.90/- plus a peon (who will travel by class III coach). No daily allowance is admissible to V.C. if he has his own place of stay.

(ii) For travelling between Siliguri and the places where there are affiliated colleges :-

- (a) If by rail, 1st class journey scheduled for 1st grade officers.
- (b) If by university car - Rs.5/- each journey
- (c) If by private vehicle 0.60 n.P. per mile.
- (d) If by air - actual fare plus Rs.8/- as incidental.

(iii) For travelling between Calcutta and Delhi :-

- (a) If by air, for each journey actual air fare plus Rs.20/- as incidental.
- (b) If by rail, for each journey Rs.120/- plus daily allowance of Rs.20/- per day or part of the day.

(iv) For travelling between Calcutta/Siliguri and any place (other than those mentioned in (i), (ii) and (iii))

- (a) If by rail, 1st class journey scheduled for 1st grade officers or air-conditioned coach where available with an incidental of Rs.20/- for each trip.
- (b) If by air - Actual air-fare plus Rs.20/- as incidental.

(v) For travelling between Siliguri and Delhi :-

- (a) If by plane via Calcutta as per provision (i)(a) and (iii)(a).
- (b) If by rail - air-conditioned fare (where air-conditioned coach available) or 1st class railway-fare plus Rs.20/- as incidental for each trip.

The meeting of the sponsors of a Co-operative Society took place on 12th August, 1964, at 5 P.M. in the Vice-Chancellor's room. The following were present:- Prof. B.N.Das Gupta (Vice-Chancellor), Mr. N. K. Sengupta, IAS, Chairman, Siliguri Wholesale Consumers' Co-operative Society Ltd., Mr. Satyesh Chakraborty, Co-operative Development Officer, Mr. S.Basak, Dr. Manas Das Gupta, Mr. P.M.Chatterjee, Mr. H. P. Bhattacharyya, Mr. Manoj Chakraborty, Mr. Apurba Chatterjee and Mr. Susil Neogi.

Every one present felt the need of a Co-operative Society and the following was drafted:-

In the University Campus (at RajaRammohunpur) we are all faced with serious difficulties in respect of supply of essential consumers' goods, such as- rice, sugar, mustard oil, stationery etc. Marketing at Siliguri means waste of time due to serious transport difficulties and uncertainty regarding availability and quality. We are all interested in a regular supply, at fair price, of essential goods ready at hand.

Therefore it is proposed that a consumers' Co-operative Society (which has been proposed to be named "RajaRammohunpur Consumers' Co-operative Society Ltd.") be immediately started at the University Campus, preferably on 15th Aug., or by the 20th Aug. at the latest. Such a Society will relieve us of all our present inconveniences regarding essential supplies. A steady supply of some of the most essential goods such as rice, sugar, etc., has already been assured by the Govt. of West Bengal. All depends on our joint efforts and our response to the purpose.

The University will as far as possible provide accommodation on nominal rent and occasionally when possible also the transport for bringing goods. Shares are available at Rs. 10/- each. One can buy a maximum number of 100 shares. Liability of members is limited. Benefits of the Society will be available to the share-holders of the proposed Society.

It is hoped that all will generously subscribe to the share-capital of the proposed Co-operative Society and will extend their helping hand to make the Society a success.



the University of North Bengal held at

1. The proceedings of the meeting held on 27-5-64 were confirmed.

2. The proceedings of the meeting of the University held on
31st May, 1964 were confirmed after correction of typographical
errors and subject to following modifications -

Item 7(a) - the last sentence of item 7(a) should be
read as follows :

"After some discussion, the Vice-Chancellor was
personally requested to explain the matter to
the Chancellor".

3. The reports of the Results Committee for publication of
results of various examinations of the University were noted.

After some discussion it was decided that the publication
of results of various examinations should, as far as possible,
synchronise with the publication of results of other Univer-
sities in the State so that there may not be any difficulty
in regard to admission of students into other colleges and
Universities for further studies. (Annexure - "A") Page - 6

4. It was resolved that the constitution and the rules of the
North Bengal University Students' Association as placed before
the meeting with approval of the Committee be adopted.

5. The report of the Finance Officer of the North Bengal University regarding the fixation of rent and other charges payable by the employees of the University for their residential and accommodation was considered and it was decided that the schedule of rents and other charges is drawn up by the Vice-Chancellor in consultation with the Finance Secretary and Dr. J.C. Sen Gupta be approved.

It was also resolved that the rents and other charges be realised from the University teachers and the administrative staff for their residential accommodation according to the rates approved.

6. (a) The rules regarding medical facilities for students, teachers and other employees of the University as drawn up by the Committee were considered and it was decided that the rules for medical facilities be approved subject to the condition that the students enjoying free and half-free studentship should be given medicine free of cost.
(b) A periodical check up of all the students of the University should be undertaken and a record be kept for each student. Students, income of whose parents or guardians is Rs.400/- p.m. and above, should pay for the medicine and the income of whose parents or guardians is less than Rs.400/- p.m. should not be charged for medicine.

During the discussions the Chancellor also stressed the need for improving the calorific value and quality of food supplied to the students in the hostels.

7. It was noted that during the temporary absence of Sri A.C. Roy, Sri K.K. Ray will act in the various committees in his place.
8. It was decided that the recommendations of the Confirmation Committee would be placed at the next meeting of the University.
9. It was agreed that the rules of Travelling Allowance should be completed and reported to the next meeting of the Executive Council.

10. The schedule of rents for accommodation chargeable from the students of the University as approved by the Sub-Committee consisting of Principal A. C. Roy, Dr. J.C. Sen Gupta and the Vice-Chancellor was noted for adoption.
11. It was decided that the list of holidays as approved by the Director of Public Instruction for educational institutions in West Bengal should be followed as far as possible in the University. It was also decided that the list of holidays should be modified and a complete list for the whole year be prepared accordingly.
12. The recommendation of the Committee relating to the number of working days in the Hill colleges was accepted with the observation that the number of more working days should be added.
13. It was decided that the consideration of item No.13 be postponed as the recommendations of the Committee for allocation of accommodation to various subjects were not ready.
14. The recommendation for starting a Consumers' Cooperative Stores at RajaRammohunpur was accepted.

The Chancellor expressed the desire that the Cooperative Stores of the University should be a model one and efforts should be made to make it modern in its organisation and as useful as possible. Some opinions were expressed that arrangements for storing fish and meat should be made for which a coldstorage will be desirable.

The Finance Secretary said that for such a Cooperative Stores, Government may readily agree to give adequate financial assistance.

Chancellor also pointed out that it was high time that vegetable gardens and fruit gardens be raised in the University campus.

16. After some discussions it was decided that the newly started Maldia Govt. B.T. College would be granted affiliation to teach following subjects :-

- i) Principles of Education including Educational Psychology,
- ii) History of Education,
- iii) General Methods, School Education, School Organisation and School Hygiene
- iv) Methods of Teaching in -
 - (a) English, (b) Bengali, (c) Sanskrit,
 - (d) History, (e) Mathematics, (f) Geography,
 - (g) Hygiene, (h) Art and Craft,
 - (i) Primary and Infant school subjects,
 - (j) Essay and Composition

On behalf of Government, Education Secretary gave assurance that necessary funds for the starting of the college, in conformity with University requirement would be found.

16. It was decided that in the absence of the crest for the University provisional certificates may be issued by the University.

17. It was decided, in connection with the item No.84 of the meeting held on 31st May 1964, that the Committee originally formed with Vice-Chancellor, Principal A.C. Roy and Dr. J.C. Sengupta, be expanded by the inclusion of Dr. R.C. Majumdar and the Committee should further go into the question of devising ways and means to improve the standard of teaching in the affiliated colleges. It was decided that early steps should be taken.

It was also suggested that if the University Grants Commission approve the opening of new subjects by their appropriate financial help, those subjects may be started in the current session provided suitable arrangements can be made.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.

1. The meeting considered the cases of the following teachers of the University who have completed their probationary period of one year:-

Mr. P.K. Chakrabarti, Lecturer in Geography, joined on 1-2-1963

Their confidential character records, the opinion of the Heads of the Departments concerned and the Vice-Chancellor's report were considered. The recommendation of the Head of the Department and of the Vice-Chancellor were placed before the Committee. It was decided that the above teachers be confirmed with effect from 1st May, 1964.

3. The question of confirmation of Dr. M. Dutta, Professor of Mathematics who had been appointed on probation for one year and whose period of probation was extended by another year, as per decision of the Confirmation Committee quoted below :-

That the period of probation of Dr. Mahadev Dutta, Professor of Mathematics be extended by one year for the present on the ground that his services have not been found satisfactory,

was considered.

The confidential character record and the Vice-Chancellor's report regarding Dr. M. Dutta were placed before the Committee. The members were of the opinion that Dr. M. Dutta's services have been found unsatisfactory and he has failed to improve both in his work and conduct during the extended period of probation. Accordingly it was decided that his services be terminated on the 14th October '66 the date on which the period of his extended probation will expire. The Committee further directed that the following notice be issued by the Registrar immediately to Dr. M. Dutta :-

"I am directed to inform you that your services in this University are terminated on 14th October 1964, i.e. the date of expiry of the period of your extended probation, as you have been found unsuitable for confirmation."
