

# A LITERARY & HISTORICAL ATLAS OF EUROPE



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## INTRODUCTION

THIS is the second volume in a set of reference atlases which the publishers have in view for the readers of "Everyman's Library," their object being to provide the literary and historical student with all the necessary geographical data to illustrate the books which he is reading. It was found impossible to give sufficient detail of the whole World in one volume, and it was decided to give an Atlas to each Continent, whose special features could there be adequately treated. Extending the lines of the *Classical Atlas*, this book attempts to cover the geography of Europe, mapped out not only to define the frontiers and countries, but to illustrate history and literature—especially English literature. The changes in the face of Europe that have marked the growth of nations, that went on through the Middle Ages, and have continued to the times of Wellington and Napoleon, the Franco-Prussian War, and to the merging to-day of the military in the industrial struggle, may be followed in the 96 pages of coloured maps which come first in the volume. In addition, some 32 pages of maps in outline will be found covering—

- (a) The great battles of the world. These are devised with an eye to Creasy's *Fifteen Decisive Battles*, and they go back to classic times; but it will be found that they help to illustrate many modern books too.
- (b) Maps which relate to English literature. These do not exhaust the field, but they serve as examples of what the student, carrying on the process, may do for himself. By illustrating certain proverbial books and special authors, they show the reader how he may, with the coloured map for his guidance, go on to trace a map to illustrate his own favourite literary region or history-book.
- (c) An Outline Map of England and Wales showing the situation of the greater monasteries and religious houses.

- (d) Two extremely interesting Outline Maps which illustrate Mediæval and Revolutionary Paris.
- (e) The Map of London as it was rebuilt after the Fire, and up to the end of the eighteenth century, must be of very great interest to all readers of Pepys, Evelyn, Johnson, and Goldsmith, and of many other great spirits who haunted these streets, for here are pictured the absolute houses in which Johnson and some of his contemporaries lived.

The small scale of the Map of the Arthurian regions, now for the first time included in an atlas, compels the omission of the local details in each district or region; but the student who shall be tempted by it to make a special map for individual romances, such as Sir Percival, Sir Tristram, or the Twrch Trwyth in the *Mabinogion*, will find in the end that he has gained a new idea of what romance means. The map of the Dickens country, again, covers nearly all the chief places of interest in the novels; but it would require a series of charts to represent each book in detail. One would like to add a Dickens London; but that, any student can make who will profit by example and trace for himself the localities of the different London stories. To do this, he will require, however, a pretty early nineteenth-century map stated in some street-detail.

Another feature which we believe to be quite unique is that we have been able, by the kindness of Mr. Bernard Roth (the eminent orthopædic surgeon), to add a sketch of the English Coinage from 150 B.C. up to King Edward VII.'s time, and to illustrate it with eight pages of examples from his own unique collection. This indeed brings reality into romance, for no longer is Shakespeare's "Cymbeline" a mythical person, but a living king who coined his own coins in his mint at Colchester, and many other dim historic personages stand out vividly when we see their image and superscription upon their own coins. This could only have been possible through the kindness of Mr. Roth, and we owe him our most hearty thanks.

We have to thank Miss Edwardes, too, for the careful compilation of a Gazetteer, drawn up with definite bearing upon local events and historic and literary associations, which, with the maps themselves to lend it reality, helps to make topography alive and human. A few places of note, it may be, are not to be

found in the maps, but this is usually because they are mere villages, fields, or roads which it would require a map of an immense scale to contain; but the latitude and longitude in each case is given so that the reader may easily locate the spot.

It is intended to follow this Atlas speedily with one of America, which will be treated on the same lines, and with the same full illustrative detail, and that in turn will be followed by separate atlases of Asia and of Africa and Australia, so that the world's geography and history will be very fully covered when the set is complete.

The publishers would like to say how much they are indebted to the skill and knowledge of Dr. Bartholomew, who has been exceedingly fruitful in suggestion and prodigal to liberality in making new plates whenever any new value could be given to the maps. Indeed, their enterprise would have been impossible, and lacking in many of its most essential features, but for his skilled aid and interest in the venture.

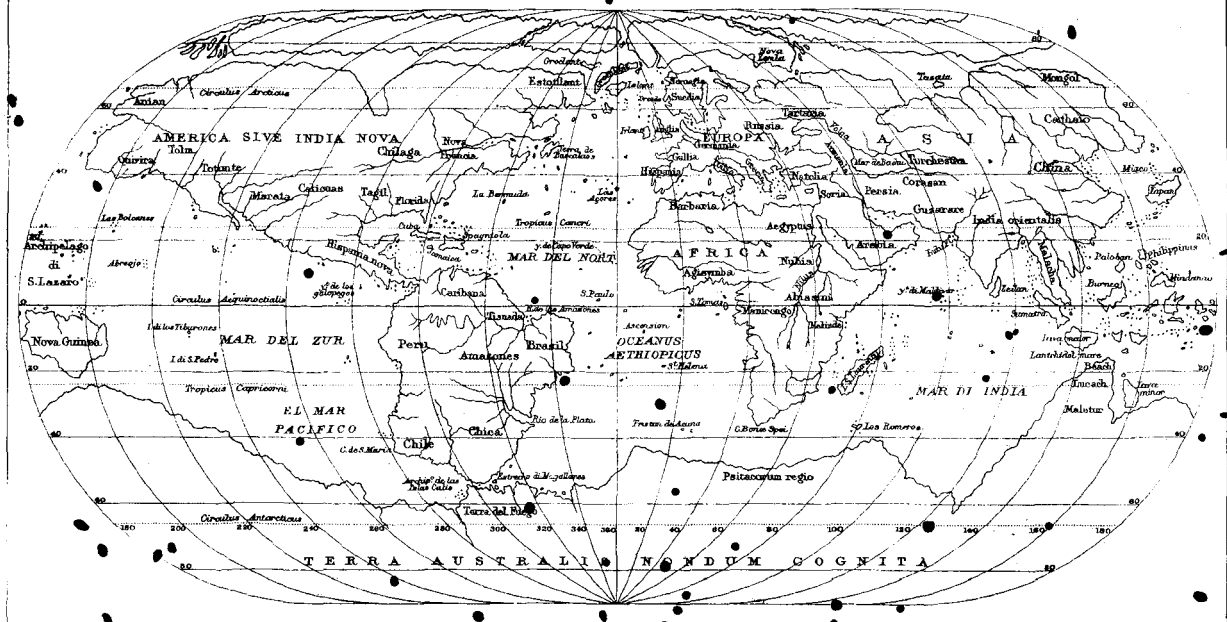
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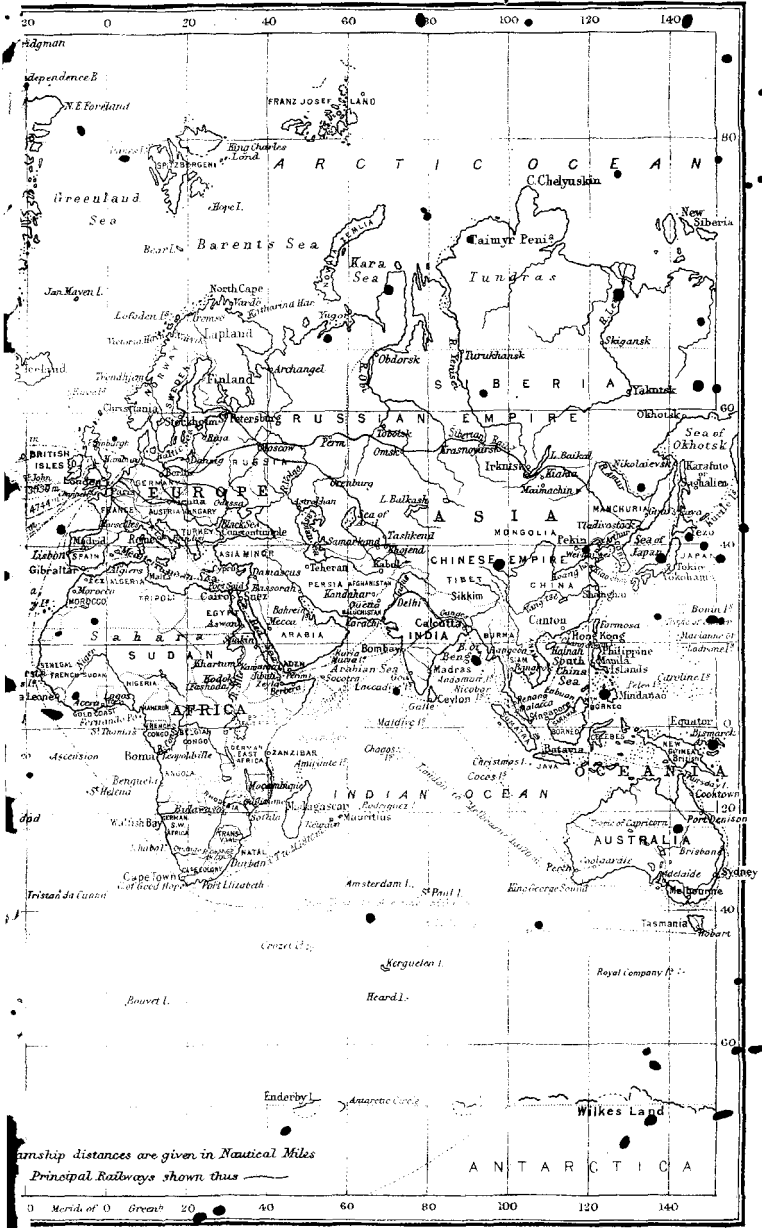
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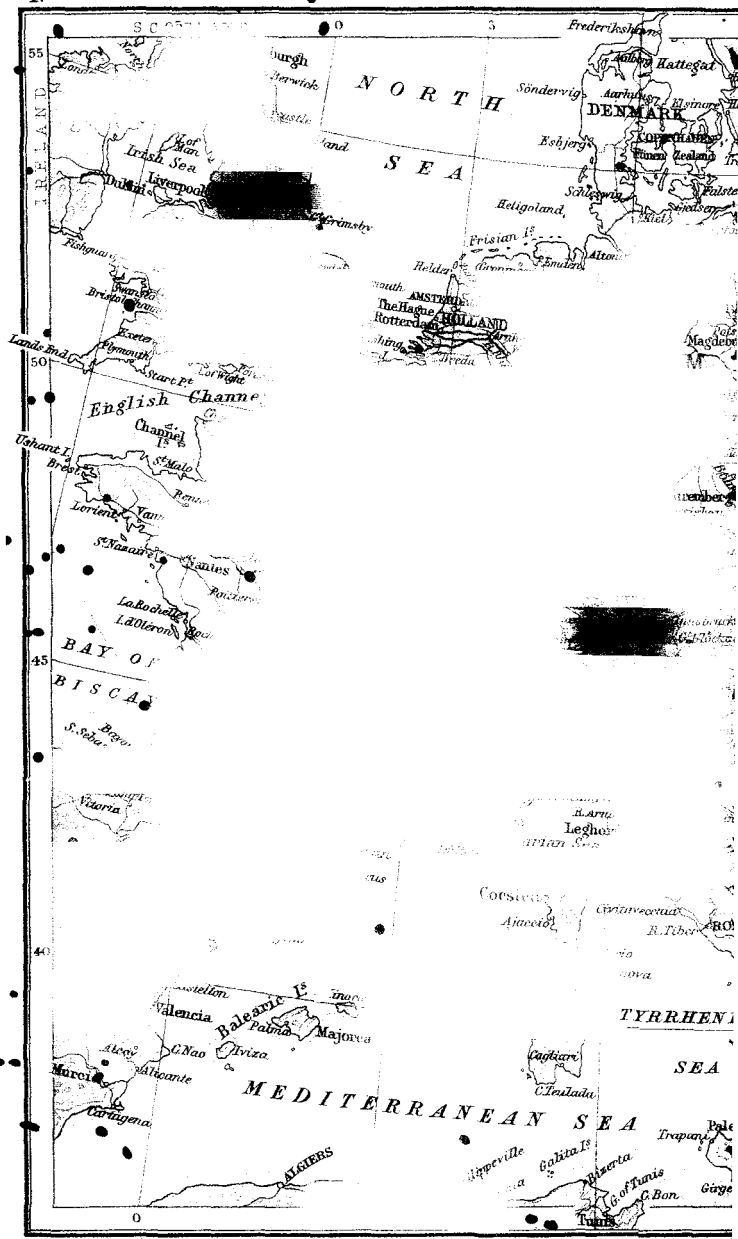
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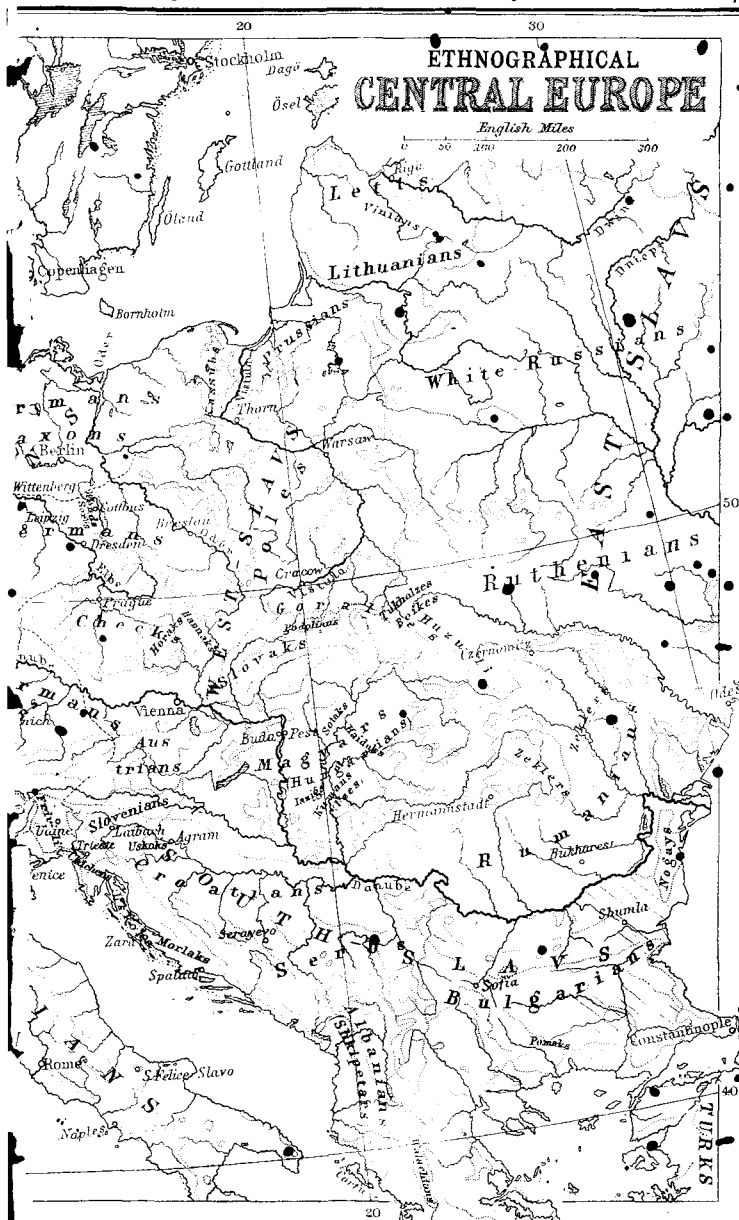


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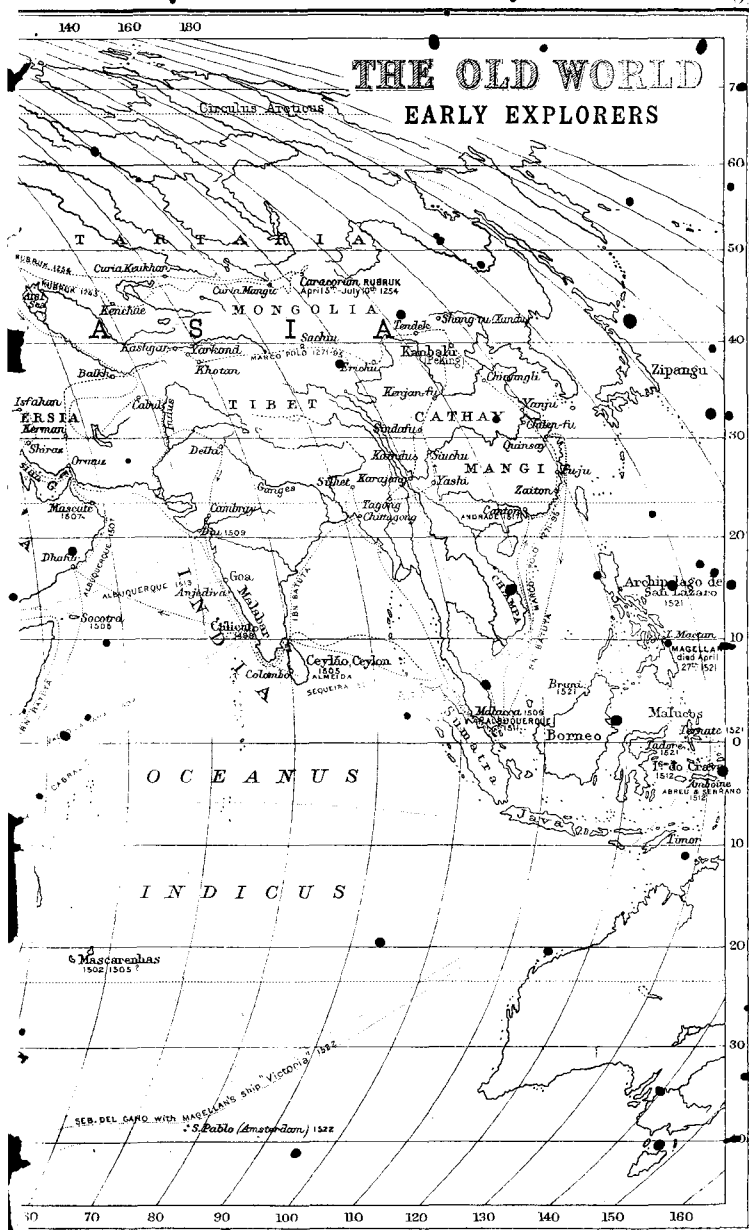




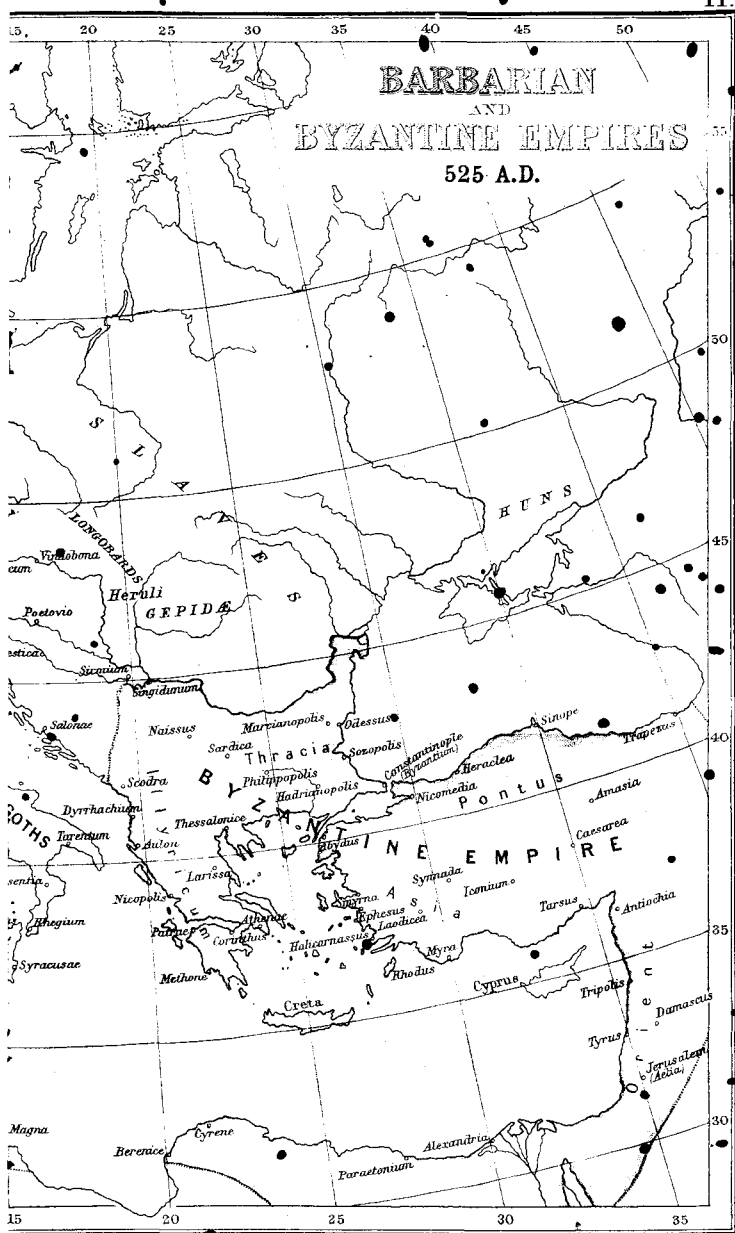
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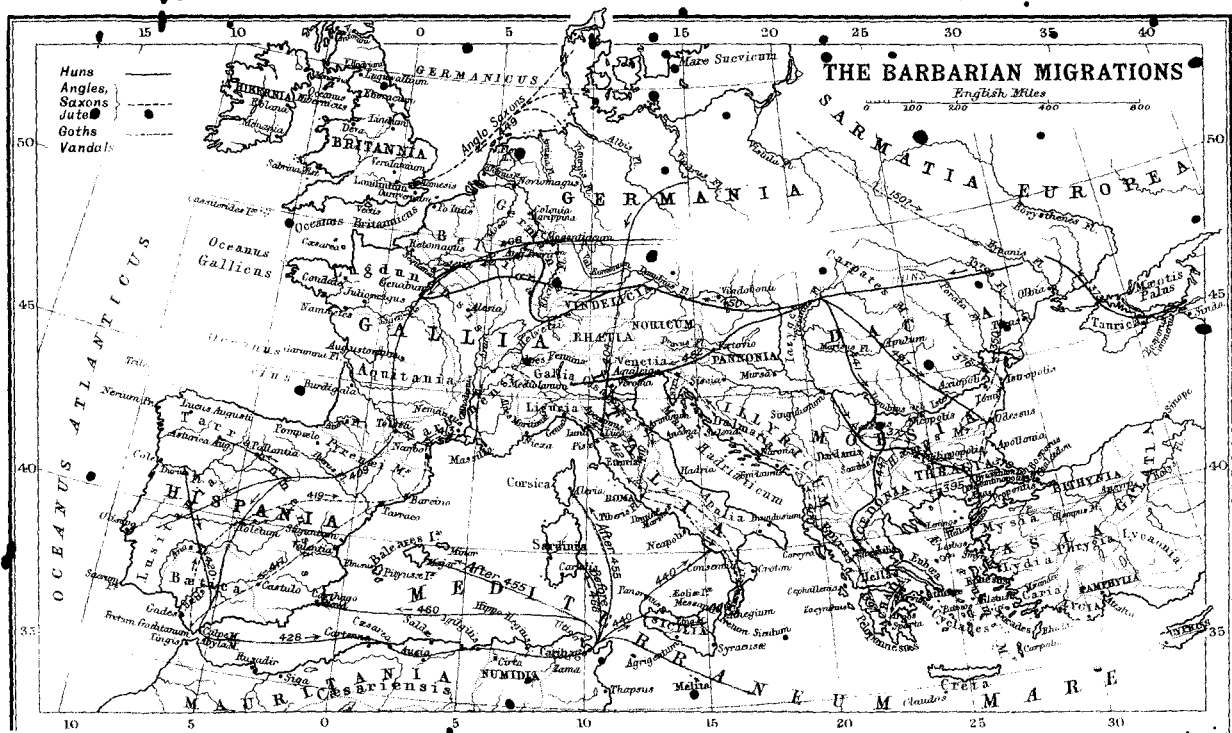
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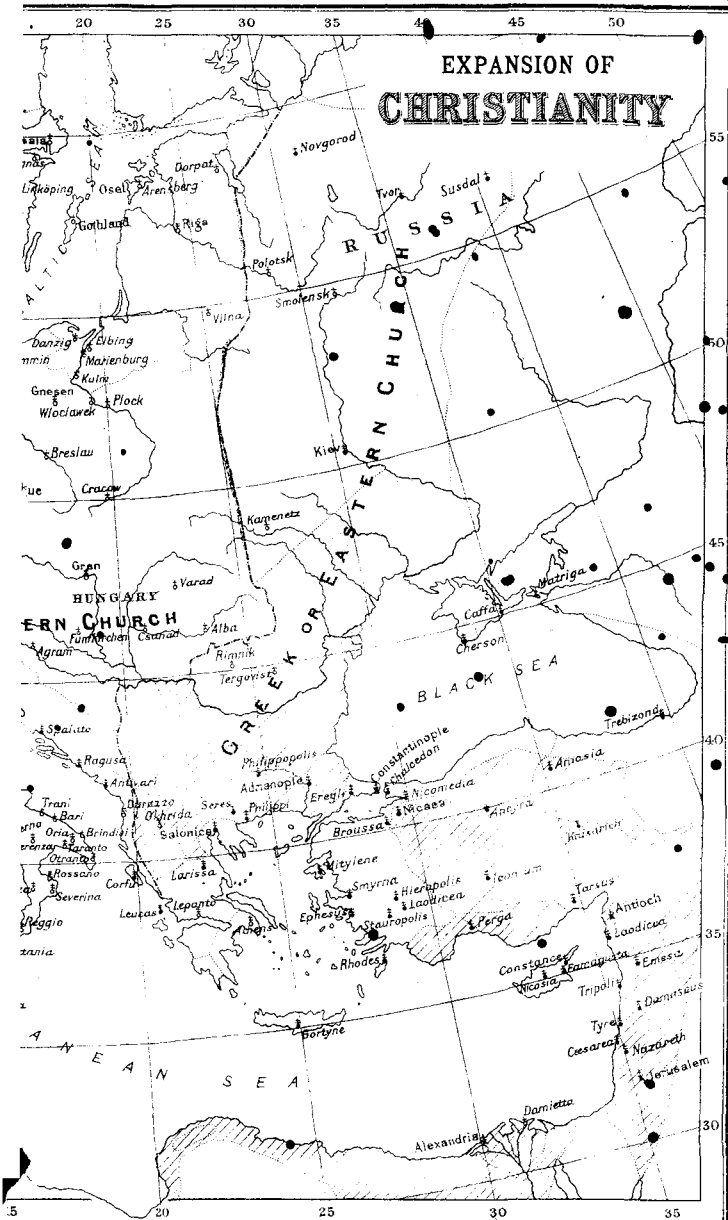


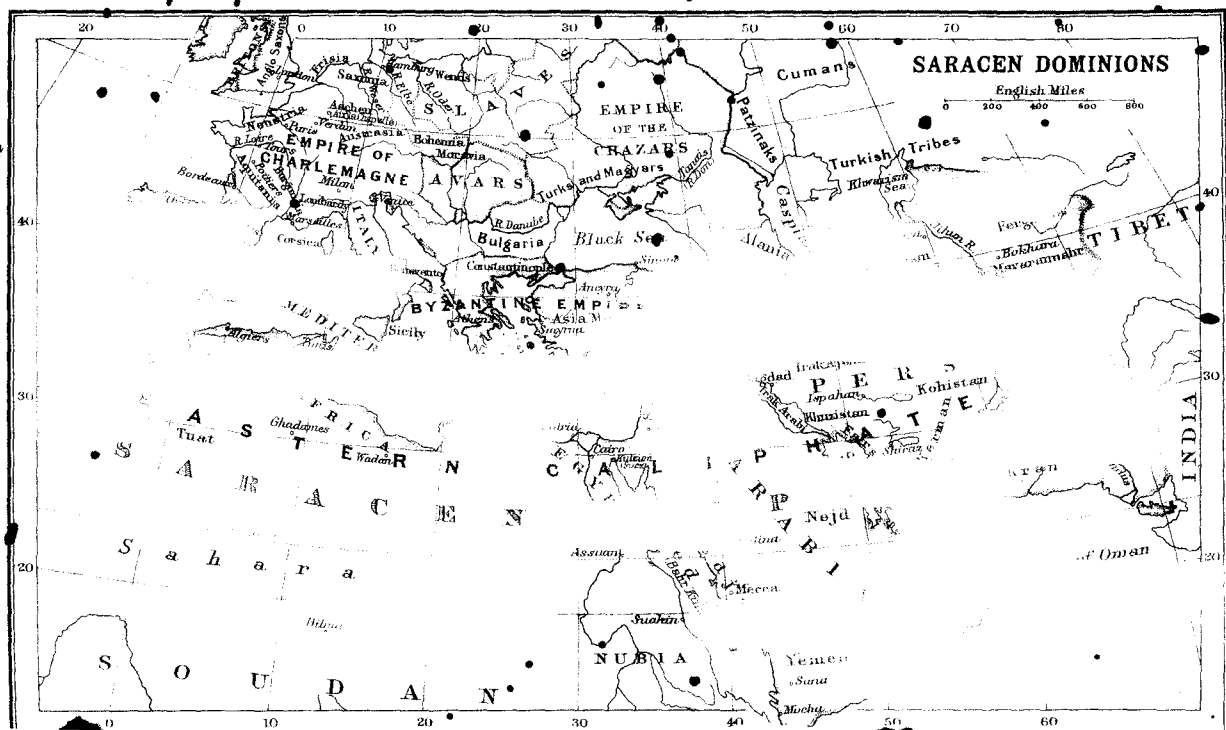

OF THE  
ENGLISH COINAGE  
FROM THE EARLIEST TIMES TO THE PRESENT DAY

THE ancient Britons were intimately related to their neighbours the Gauls on the other side of the English Channel, and through them early obtained a knowledge of a well designed coinage, chiefly of gold, which was minted for nearly 250 years. According to Sir John Evans, the gold uninscribed coins of the south coast were probably first issued between 200 and 150 B.C. These gold coins are usually described as staters, because they are degenerate copies of the beautifully executed gold staters of Philip II., King of Macedon, father of Alexander the Great (B.C. 382-336).

Fig. I., Plate I., is a gold stater of that king; on the *obverse*, i.e., the more important side, of the coin, which usually carries the king's head or the chief symbol, is a laureate head of Apollo or Hercules looking to the right; on the other side (*reverse*) is a charioteer in a biga, or two-horsed chariot, with two wheels.

Fig. II., Plate I., is an ancient British gold coin of about B.C. 150, which is a barbarous copy of the perfect Greek art seen in Fig. I. On the *obverse* is a large head to the left with extremely ornate hair, etc., while on the *reverse* is a very disjointed horse with the remnants of a winged charioteer.

Fig. III., Plate I., is a fine specimen of a later ancient British inscribed coin of Cunobelinus (Shakespeare's Cymbeline), a British king who flourished about A.D. 5: his

capital was Camulodonum, on the site of which is modern Colchester. On the obverse is a horse with CVNO below, and on the reverse is an ear of wheat with CA MV on either side. The latest and most barbarously designed ancient British coins were those of the Brigantes, a tribe who inhabited Yorkshire, Lancashire, and other northern counties. Some years before their conquest by the Romans in A.D. 69, their queen was Cartismandua, who is said to have treacherously delivered up to the invaders Caractacus who had taken refuge in her court.

Fig. IV., Plate I., is a gold stater of the Brigantes, in which it is still possible to find some distant resemblance to the design on Philip's coin. On the obverse there are remains of the wreath with locks of hair, but it is difficult to picture any likeness to a face. These ancient Britons were far more civilised than many historians have described them to be. I have several contemporary forgeries of ancient British staters in my collection. They consist of copper covered with a thin plating of gold: a high degree of mechanical skill was required to produce such a forged coin.

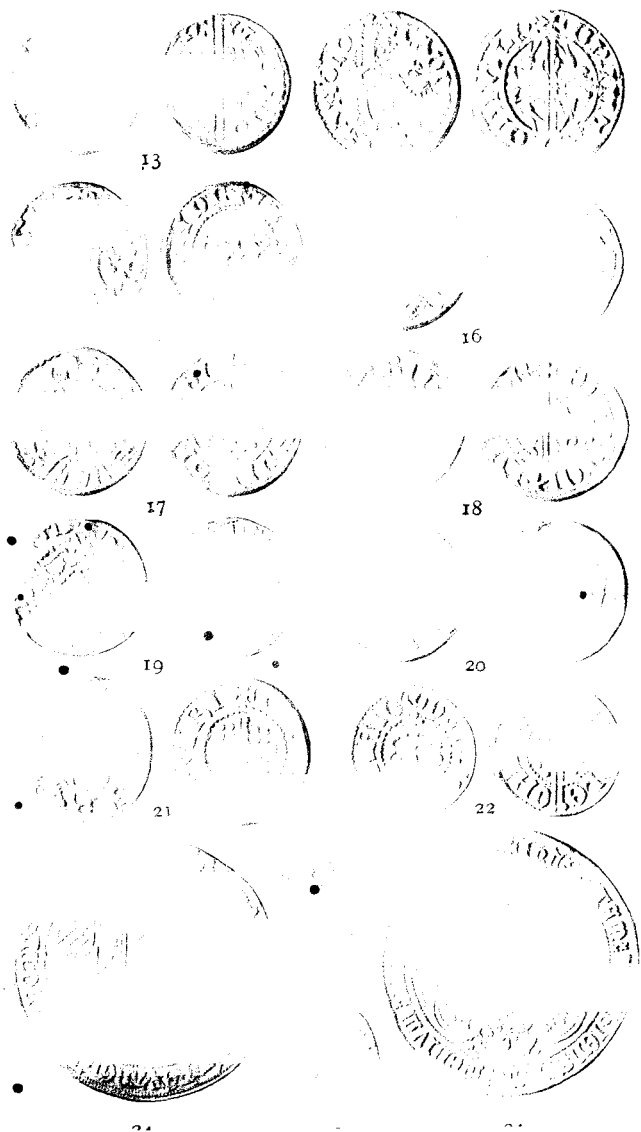
For several centuries after the Roman invasion all traces of a native coinage disappear till we come to the period of the Sceats and Stycas. The sceats were the earliest Saxon coins struck in England, and were chiefly in silver, although gold specimens are known.

Fig. V., Plate I., is a gold sceat which is supposed to have been struck by Abbo, a Frankish moneyer who accompanied St. Augustine to England in A.D. 596: on the obverse is a rude bust to the left with E behind; on the reverse traces of letters around a dotted inner border enclosing a large H-shaped ornament in centre, with letters above and below. The stycas resemble the sceats, but are usually of very base silver or copper.

Fig. VI., Plate I., is a copper styca of Vigmund, Archbishop of York (A.D. 837-854). The silver penny or, as it was called in early days, the *novus denarius* was of Frankish origin, and was first struck by Pepin the Short in 755. This coin rapidly became popular all over Europe, and drove out, not only the up to then current Roman coins, but also the sceats and the stycas. Offa, King of Mercia (A.D. 757-796), was the first English prince to strike silver pennies, and all his coins are of beautiful types.

Fig. VII., Plate I., is a silver penny of King Offa, while Fig. VIII., Plate I., is one of his widowed queen, Cynethryth, who reigned for one year after his death. Contrary to the almost universal custom, the queen's name is on the reverse of the coin, while the name of the mint master, or moneyer, EOBA, is on the obverse, in front of the queen's bust. For many centuries the silver penny was the only current English coin, and when smaller change was required it was cut into halves and quarters to form halfpennies and farthings, an operation which was often helped by the large cross on the reverse.

Fig. IX., Plate I., is a penny of Alfred the Great (871-901), with the monogram of London on the reverse: the portrait of the king on the obverse is fairly good, but the whole coin is far inferior in execution to those of King Offa and his queen. Aethelred II. (979-1016) struck a large number of different types; one of the most interesting of his pennies is shown in Fig. X., Plate I., with the king's head on the obverse and the so-called hand of Providence between A and  $\omega$  descending from the clouds on the reverse. Our Danish King Canute (1016-1035) issued a number of different pennies, of which Fig. XI., Plate I., is one which was minted at Dover. Fig. XII., Plate I., is a penny of Harold I. (1035-1040), and Fig. XIII., Plate II., a penny of Harthacnut (1040-1042). Silver pennies of Edward the Confessor (1042-1066) were struck in upwards of sixty different English towns, and are of various types. Fig. XIV., Plate II., represents his "sovereign" type. On the obverse the king is seen sitting on his throne, holding the sceptre in the right hand and the orb in the left; on the reverse we have what is termed a short cross voided with a martlet (bird) in each of the four quarters: this has usually been described as the Confessor's arms. Harold II. (1066), although he reigned only a few months, struck some coins of which Fig. XV., Plate II., represents a penny, with the king's head to the left with the sceptre in front; on the reverse we find PAX (Peace) across the coin, which is rather incongruous, seeing he met his death so soon after at the Battle of Hastings. William the Conqueror (1066-1087) struck pennies with a good portrait of himself, of which Fig. XVI., Plate II., is a fine specimen: it is usually termed the bonnet type, owing to the curious head-dress or crown



on the king's head. William Rufus (1087-1100) did not vary much the coins of his father, and Fig. XVII., Plate II., represents a penny of his struck at Ipswich.

Henry I. (1100-1135) struck several types, of which Fig. XVIII., Plate II., minted at London, is an interesting specimen. Stephen's troubled reign (1135-1154) is reflected by the clumsy and badly struck pennies of his coinage. One rarely ever meets with a well struck and round coin of this king. Fig. XIX., Plate II., is a Stephen penny struck at Gloucester. The Empress Matilda, daughter of Henry I., was Queen of England for a year during this reign, and struck coins in several towns.

Fig. XX., Plate II., represents what is considered a fine specimen of a Matilda penny. In spite of the bad execution of the coins of Stephen and Matilda, the silver employed was not debased. Henry II. (1154-1189), after his first issue, struck the "short cross" penny, of which Fig. XXI., Plate II., is a specimen minted at Worcester. This same "short cross" penny was struck without alteration of type and with the same name, Henricus, during the succeeding reigns of Richard I. (1189-1199) and John (1199-1216), and was continued unchanged during the greater portion of the reign of Henry III. (1216-1272), till the year 1248, when the "long cross" penny was struck: in this, the voided or double-lined cross on the reverse extends to the margin of the coin instead of only to the inner circle, as in the short cross variety. This king also added the numerals III. (or the Latin equivalent) after his name, to distinguish himself from his predecessors, the first time this device was employed in the English coinage (see Fig. XXII., Plate II., which is a long cross penny of Henry III.).

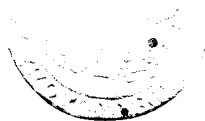
Edward I. (1272-1307) coined for the first time halfpennies and farthings, instead of having pennies cut into halves and quarters, as had been the custom till that time. Fig. XXIII., Plate II., is a farthing struck at York. The coinage of Edward II. (1307-1327) is so similar to that of Edward I. that even experts differ amongst themselves as to whom they should be assigned. Edward III. (1327-1377) made several important innovations: he not only issued a gold coinage, but also larger silver coins, viz., groats (fourpence) and half groats (twopence); his second gold coinage was the Noble, shown in Fig. XXIV., Plate II. This beautiful



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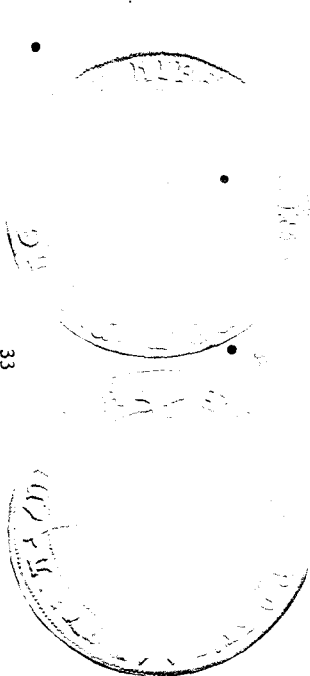
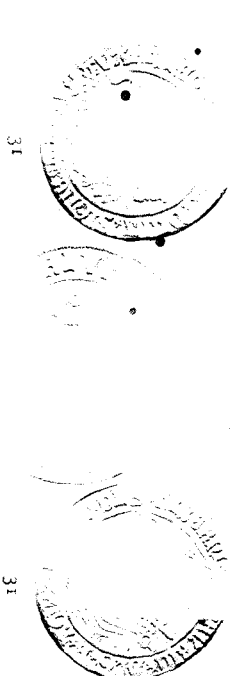
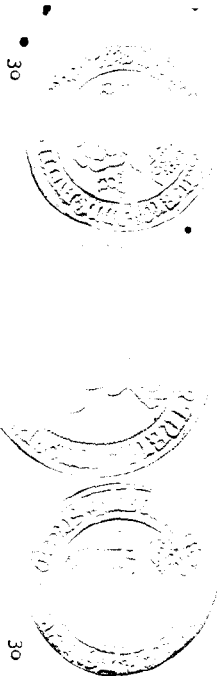


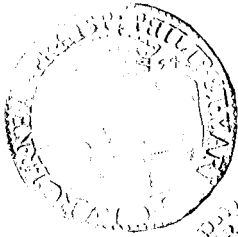
work of art was current for six shillings and eightpence. On the obverse the king standing in the ship, is supposed to refer to the victory over the French fleet off Sluys in 1340. Fig. XXV., Plate III., is a groat of Edward III. During this king's reign there was a great expansion of the Norman possessions of the English crown, with a corresponding increase in the output of Anglo-Gallic coins. Fig. XXVI., Plate III., is a gold Pavillon or Royal d'Or of his son, Edward the Black Prince. It is interesting to note that there are four ostrich feathers on the obverse of the coin, two on each side of the bust of that prince.

Richard II. (1377-1399) and Henry IV. (1399-1413), Henry V. (1413-1422) and Henry VI. (1422-1461), made little changes in the coinages, except that the last king struck two new coins, the angel and half angel. Fig. XXVII., Plate III., is the angel, which was current for six shillings and eightpence. On the obverse is the Archangel St. Michael piercing the dragon, and on the reverse a ship to the right with the mast shaped like a cross, surmounted by a top castle.

Edward IV. (1461-1483) issued one new coin, the rose noble, shown in Fig. XXVIII., Plate III., which differs from the noble by having the rose on the side of the ship and in the centre of the reverse. Rose nobles were not only struck at the Tower, but also at Bristol, Coventry, York (Eboracum), and Norwich, and to distinguish these several mints the initial letter of the town was placed on the waves below the ship: thus in the rose noble figured there is a B for Bristol. The coins of Edward V. (1483) were exactly like his father's, and are only to be distinguished by their mint marks. Richard III. (1483-1485) had no distinguishing coins.

Henry VII. (1485-1509) struck a very fine new gold coin, the sovereign, double the weight of the noble, viz., 240 grains, and was current for twenty shillings: it is shown in Fig. XXIX., Plate IV. This same king also issued the first shilling or testoon. Henry VIII. (1509-1547) struck two new gold coins, the gold crown and the gold George noble, which were current for five shillings, and six shillings and eightpence respectively. Fig. XXX., Plate IV., is the crown and Fig. XXXI., Plate IV., the George noble, which has on the reverse St. George in armour on horseback and

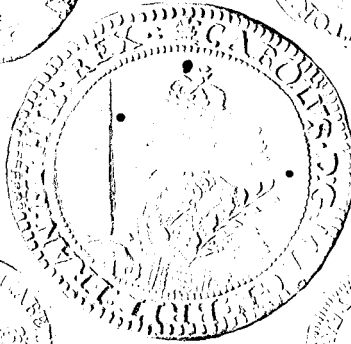




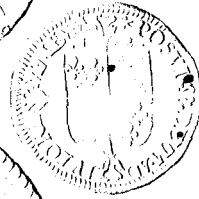
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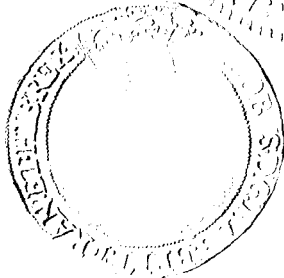
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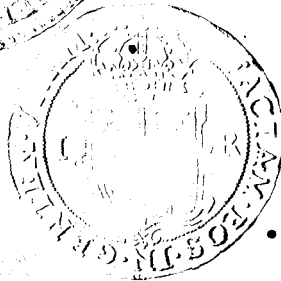
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piercing the dragon. The shilling or testoon (Fig. XXXII., Plate IV.) gives a good portrait of the king.

Edward VI. (1547-1553) struck the first silver crown, shown in Fig. XXXIII., Plate IV. Mary (1553-1558), after her marriage with Philip II. of Spain, struck coins with the portrait of her husband as well as of herself, as seen in the shilling (Fig. XXXIV., Plate V.). The Spanish king's name is invariably placed first, before that of the English queen.

Elizabeth (1558-1603) issued a dated sixpence yearly for upwards of forty years, and Fig. XXXV., Plate V., is a milled sixpence of the year 1562: her dress is very ornate, as is the rule on all her coins.

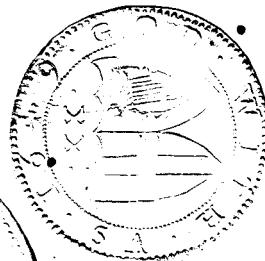
When James VI. of Scotland became James I. of England (1603-1625) he struck several coins to symbolise the union of the kingdoms. Fig. XXXVI., Plate V., is the gold unite or sovereign. The reverse legend—"Faciam eos in gentem unam"—is from Ezekiel xxxvii. 22, "*I will make them one nation in the land upon the mountains of Israel; and one king shall be king to them all: and they shall be no more two nations, neither shall they be divided into two kingdoms any more.*"

Charles I.'s troubled and tragic reign (1625-1649) produced innumerable new coins. While at Oxford, the gold three-pound piece (Fig. XXXVII., Plate V.) and the silver pound or twenty shilling piece (Fig. XXXVIII., Plate VI.) were made out of the melted-down plate of the Oxford colleges. Amongst the many siege pieces of this reign, the shilling of Pontefract Castle (Fig. XXXIX., Plate VI.) is very typical.

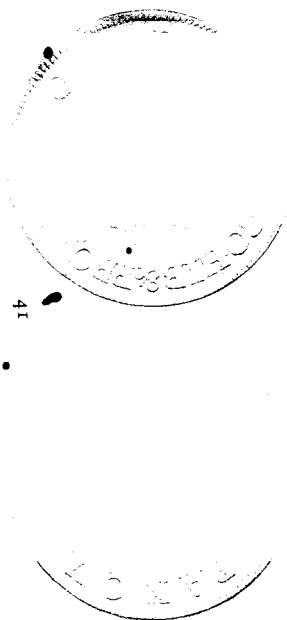
The Commonwealth coinage (1649-1660) is remarkable in having all the legends in good honest English instead of in Latin, and Fig. XL., Plate VI., represents the gold broad or twenty-shilling piece. Oliver Cromwell (1653-1658) had some coins struck with his portrait, but it is doubtful whether they were ever in circulation. The crown, by Thomas Simon (Fig. XLI., Plate VII.), is a fine work of art.

Charles II. (1660-1685) gave us the first five-guinea piece (Fig. XLII., Plate VII.). His example was followed by James II. (1685-1688), William and Mary (1689-1694) (see Fig. XLIII., Plate VII.), William (1694-1702), Anne (1702-1714), and the first two Georges (1714-1760).

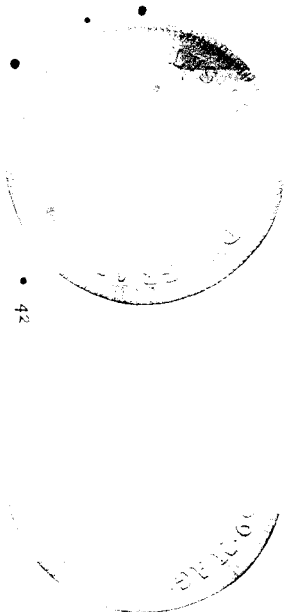
George III. (1760-1820) was the last king to issue the



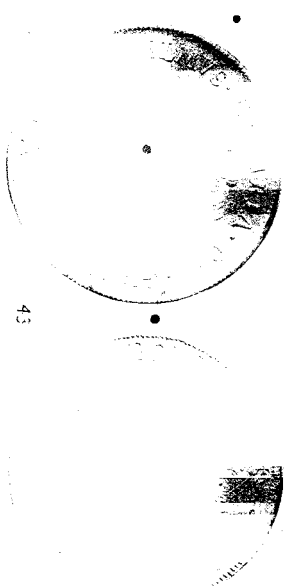

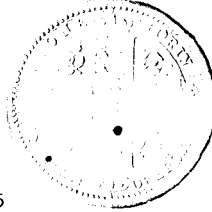
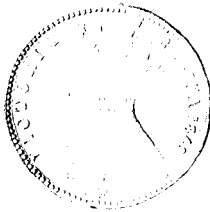

guinea, of which the spade variety (Fig. XLIV., Plate VIII.) is well known. The modern sovereign of twenty shillings was first struck by this king (Fig. XLV., Plate VIII.).

The coinages of George IV. (1820-1830) and William IV. (1830-1837) have no new features.

Queen Victoria (1837-1901) issued two new silver coins, the double florin of four shillings and the florin of two shillings. The first florin (Fig. XLVI., Plate VIII.) was issued in 1849, and as the words "Dei Gratia" were omitted, it is known as the "godless or graceless florin."

Edward VII. (1901-1910) issued the same coins as his mother, from the five-pound piece down to the farthing, with the exception of the double florin. Fig. XLVII., Plate VIII., is his five-pound piece.

All the illustrations are from photographs of casts taken from coins in the author's collection.

Naples, Italy. 40N. 14E. Part of former kingdom of the Two Sicilies, successively under Norman, Hohenstaufen, Angevine, Arragonese, and Bourbon rule; Joseph Buonaparte king, 1806; Murat king, 1808; Bourbons finally overthrown by Garibaldi, 1860; an insurrection against Spanish rule was headed by Masaniello, 1647.

Narbonne, France. 43N. 3E. Order for arrest of Cinq-Mars signed by Louis XIII., 1642. (See A. de Vigny, 'Cinq-Mars'.)

Narva, Russia. 59N. 28E. Russians defeated by Charles XII. of Sweden, 1700; taken by Peter the Great, 1704. (See Voltaire, op. cit.)

Nohant, France. 46N. 1E. Home of George Sand (1804-76).

Noia, Italy. 40N. 14E. Bp. of Giordano Bruno, philosopher (1548, burnt 1600).

Norham, Northumberland, En. 55N. 2W. Sc. old Border warfare; King John and Edward I. at; besieged by James IV., 1497, taken by him 1513. (See Scott's 'Marmion'.)

Northallerton, Yorks., En. 54N. 1W. Near was fought the battle of the Standard, when David I. of Scotland was defeated, 1138.

Northampton, cap. of county, En. 52N. 0W. Barons swore homage to Empress Matilda, 1131; Treaty of, establishing independence of Scotland. 1328: Henry VI. defeated by

Warwick and made prisoner, 1460; held by Parliamentarians during Civil W.; Holmby House near, Charles I.'s prison, 1647.

Norwich, Norfolk, En. 52N. 1E. Res. and grave of Sir T. Browne, A. of 'Religio Medici' (1605-82); Nelson educated at grammar school; bp. of Greene, the dramatist, and Harriet Martineau; early home of Elizabeth Fry. (See Borrow, 'Lavengro'.)

Nottingham, cap. of county, En. 52N. 1W. Roger Mortimer seized and carried to his death, 1330; here Charles I. raised his standard, 1642; castle held for Parliamentarians by Colonel Hutchinson. (See Life, by his wife.)

Novara, Italy. 45N. 8E. Piedmontese defeated, 1849 (Italian Rising).

Novi, Italy. 44N. 8E. French defeated by Russians and Austrians under Suvarov, and Joubert killed, 1799.

Noyon, France. 49N. 2E. Charlemagne crowned, 768; Hughes Capet elected king, 987; bp. of Calvin (1509-64).

Nuneaton, Warwick, En. 52N. 1W. 'George Eliot' here at school.

Nuremberg, Bavaria. 49N. 11E. Watches (Nuremberg eggs), globes, air guns, etc., invented; splendid specimens of work by sculptors Kraft, Stoss, and Vischer; Treaty (Catholics and Protestants), 1532; fierce fighting between Wallenstein and Gustavus Adolphus, 1532; bp. of Albert Dürer and Hans Sachs, one of the 'Meistersingers'.

Ocana, Spain. 39N. 3W. Defeat of Spaniards by French under Soult (Peninsular War), 1809.

Odcombe, Somerset, En. 50N. 2W. Bp. of Thomas Coryat, A. of the 'Crudities' (1577(?) - 1617).

Odense, Fünen. 55N. 10E. Bp. of Hans Andersen (1805-75).

Odessa, Russia. 46N. 30E. Bombarded by Anglo-French fleet, 1854.

Offley, Herts, En. 51N. 0W. Reported grave of King Offa, d. 796.

Olmütz, Moravia. 49N. 17E. Sacked during Thirty Years' W.; besieged by Frederick the Great (Seven Years' W.); Lafayette state prisoner at, 1792-97.

Olney, Bucks, En. 52N. 0W. Res. of the poet Cowper, 1767-86, and where he wrote 'John Gilpin'.

Öltenitz, Roumania. 44N. 26E. Russians defeated by Turks (Crimean W.), 1853.

Oporto, Portugal. 41N. 8W. Sc. frequent insurrections; taken from the French by Wellington, 1809; rose against usurper Miguel, 1828; headquarters of Dom Pedro, 1832-3.

Oppenheim, Rhenish prov. 49N. 8E. Suffered during Thirty Years' W.; taken by French, 1792 and 1794.

Orange, France. 44N. 4E. Triumphant arch and other fine Roman remains.

Orleans, France. 47N. 1E. Attacked by Attila, 450, and taken by Clovis, 486; besieged by English and delivered by Joan of Arc, 1428-9; taken by Mademoiselle de

Montpensier (Fronde W.), 1652; occupied by Germans, 1870.

Orthez, France. 43N. ow. Froissart at, 1388; Soulé defeated by Wellington near, 1814.

Ostend, Belgium. 51N. 2E. Besieged by Spaniards, July, 1601-September, 1604; surrendered to Allies, 1706; taken by French, 1745, 1792, and 1793; bombarded by English, 1798.

Ostrolenka, Russia. 53N. 21E. Russians defeated by Oudinot, 1807; by insurgent Poles, 1831; by Turks, 1853 (Crimean W.).

Ostrovno, Russia. 48N. 27E. Russian corps defeated by Ney and Prince Eugène, 1812.

Oswestry (Oswald's Tree), Salop, En. 52N. 3W. St. Oswald, King of Northumberland, slain in battle against Penda of Mercia, 642; taken and burnt by King John, and later by Llewellyn; taken by Parliamentarians, 1644.

Otranto, Italy. 40N. 18E. Taken and inhabitants massacred by the Turks, 1480. (See Horace Walpole, 'Castle of O.')

Otterburn, Northumberland, En. 55N. 2W. Famous battle commemorated in old ballad; Hotspur made prisoner and Douglas slain.

Ottery St. Mary, Devons., En. 50N. 3W. Res. awhile of Sir W. Raleigh; bp. of Coleridge (1772-1834). (The Clavering St. Mary of Thackeray's 'Pendennis'.)

Oudenarde, Belgium. 50N. 3E. Taken by Marlborough, 1706; French defeated by, 1708.

Oviedo, Spain. 43N. 5W. Taken by Ney, 1809; taken and retaken later during Peninsular W.

Oxford, En. 51N. 1W. First colls. f., Balliol, Merton, and University, latter half of 13th century; Edmund Ironside d., or killed here, according to some historians, 1016; Empress Maude besieged, 1142; 'Provisions of Oxford' drawn up by 'Mad Parliament', 1258; Ridley and Latimer martyred, 1555; Cranmer, 1556; surrendered to Parliamentarians, 1646; bp. of Richard I. and John.

Paderborn, Westphalia. 51N. 8E. Charlemagne held several diets here; his headquarters during the war with the Saxons.

Padua, Italy. 45N. 11E. Destroyed in turns by Alaric and Attila; restored by Charlemagne; the Carrara were rulers after 1318; taken by Venice, 1405; Austrian possession, 1797-1805, 1814-1866, when incorporated in kingdom of Italy; bp. of the painter Mantegna.

Palermo, Sicily. 38N. 13E. Sicilian Vespers, 1282; revolt against Bourbon rule, 1820, 1848; freed by Garibaldi and his 'Thousand', 1860.

Palestrina, Italy. 41N. 12E. Neapolitans routed by Garibaldi, 1849.

Palestro, Italy. 45N. 9E. Defeat of Austrians by Piedmontese and French, 1859 (Unification of Italy).

Pallas, Longford, Ir. 52N. 8W. Bp. of Oliver Goldsmith (1728-74).

Palos, Spain. 37N. 6W. Old port where Columbus embarked for his great voyage.

Pampeluna, Spain. 42N. 1W. Ancient capital of Navarre; taken by Charlemagne, 778; taken and retaken later by French and Spaniards; Loyola, founder of the Jesuits, wounded during defence of, 1521; sc. conflicts during Civil W. (1831-42).

Paris, Turkey. 39N. 20E. Brought under Turkish control by Ali Pacha, 1819, when the inhabitants all migrated.

Paris, France. 48N. 2E. Bastille taken, 1789; occupied by Allies, 1814; entry of Louis XVIII., 1815; revolution and Louis Philippe king, 1830-48; coup d'état, 1851; invested by German army, Sept., 1870-Jan. 1871; insurrection and government of Commune, 1871. (See Lytton, 'The Parisians'; Daudet, 'Robert Helmont'; Zola, 'The Downfall'; Erckmann-Chatrian, 'The Plébisците').

Parma, duchy and town of, Italy. 44N. 10E. Town besieged by Frederick II., 1245 and 1248; subsequently under rule in turn of the Correggio, Este, Visconti, the Pope, and Farnese.

Passau, Bavaria. 49N. 13E. Suffered during wars of 1808 and 1809.

Patay, France. 48N. 2E. English defeated by Joan of Arc and Richemont, and Talbot made prisoner, 1429; series of engagements between French and Germans, 1870.

Pau, France. 43N. ow. Former capital of Béarn; bp. of Jeanne d'Albret and her son, Henri IV., and of Bernadotte (Charles XIV. of Sweden).

Pavia, Italy. 45N. 9E. Ancient capital of the Lombards from 584-775, when delivered into Charlemagne's hands; the Languschi and Beccaria were rival lords, 13th and 14th centuries, the latter exterminated by the Duke of Milan, 1418; Francis I. defeated under its walls and taken prisoner, 1525; taken by the French, 1796; bp. of Lanfranc, cir. 1005-1089.

Peel, Isle of Man. 54N. 4W. (See Scott, 'Peveril of the Peak'.)

Pembroke, cap. of county, Wa. 51N. 4W. Taken by Cromwell, 1648; bp. of Henry VII.

Peníscola, Spain. 40N. 0E. In possession of French, 1811-14.

Penshurst, Kent, En. 51N. 0E. Bp. of Sir Philip and Algernon Sidney.

Penzance, Cornwall, En. 50N. 5W. Burned by small force of Spaniards, 1595; sacked by Fairfax, 1646; bp. of Sir Humphrey Davy (1778-1829).

Perigord, France. 45N. 0E. Bp. of Montaigne, essayist (1533-92).

Perigueux, France. 45N. 0E. Suffered during Hundred Years' W. and the Fronde.

Peronne, France. 49N. 2E. Charles the Simple a prisoner here for 6 years before his death; Louis XI. held prisoner by Duc de Bourgogne, and forced to sign treaty, 1468; retaken by, 1477; treaty signed by nobles of Picardy, the beginning of the Ligue, 1576; taken by Germans, 1871.

Perpignan, Pyrenees. 42N. 2E. Old capital of Roussillon; taken by French after long siege, 1475; became in turns Spanish and French possession, 1493, 1642.

Perth, cap. of county, Scot. 56N. 3W. Famous sermon on 'Idolatry' by Knox, 1559; James I. of Scotland assassinated, 1437; Gowrie conspiracy, 1600; Chevalier proclaimed James VIII., 1715, 1745 (See Scott, 'Fair Maid of Perth'.)

Perugia, Italy. 43N. 12E. Seven years' siege by Goths, 6th century; later in possession of Lombards; taken from Pope by Condottiere Forte-Braccio, 1416; possession of disputed by the Oddi and Baglioni, 15th-16th centuries; papal possession till 1860. (See Matarazzo's 'Chronicles'.)

Pesaro, Italy. 43N. 12E. Destroyed by Totila, 6th century; bp. of Rossini, the composer.

Peschiera, Italy. 45N. 10E. One of the Quadrilaterals; taken in turns by French and Allies, 1796-1801; by Sardinians and Austrians, 1848.

Peterborough, Northampton, En. 52N. 0W. Ass. Hereward the Wake; Queen Catherine of Aragon buried in cathedral, 1536; grave of Mary Queen of Scots, 1587-1612; portrait of 'Old Scarlett' who buried both; Cromwell at, 1643.

Petherton, North, Somerset, En. 50N. 4W. Chaucer appointed forester, 1390-1.

Peterwardein, Austria-Hungary. 45N. 19E. Soldiers assembled by Peter the Hermit for first crusade; great victory of Prince Eugène over Turks, 1716; siege by Austrians and capitulation of Hungarians, 1848, 1849.

Pevensey, Sussex, En. 50N. 0E. Landing-place of William the Conqueror.

Pezenas, France. 43N. 3W. Taken by Simon de Montfort, 1211; here Molière wrote his 'Précieuses Ridicules'.

Phalsbourg, Lorraine. 48N. 7E. Defended against Allies, 1814, 1815; taken by Germans, 1870. (See Erckmann-Chatrian, 'Le Blocus'.)

Philiphaugh, Selkirk, Scot. 55N. 2W. Montrose defeated by Leslie, 1645.

Philippsbourg, Germany. 49N. 8E. Sc. frequent sieges, 1633-1734; Marshal de Berwick killed, 1734; taken by French, 1799.

Piacenza, Italy. 45N. 9E. First crusade preached at Council, 1095; the Scotti power from 1254; passed to Visconti, 1332-1447; sacked by Sforza, 1447; possession in turns of the Pope and Farnese from 1511; defeat of Franco-Spanish forces by Austro-Sardinian, 1746; occupied by French, 1799, 1800.

Picquigny, France. 49N. 2E. William Long-sword assassinated, 942; treaty between Edward IV. and Louis XI., 1457.

Pidavro (Epidaure), Greece. 37N. 22E. National congress to proclaim independence of Greece, 1822.

Pilsen, Bohemia. 49N. 13E. Taken by Ziska (Hussite W.), by Mansfeld (Thirty

Years' W.); headquarters of Wallenstein, 1633-4.

Pinerolo, Pignerol, Italy. 44N. 7E. Prison of Man with the Iron Mask, 1666-86.

Pinkie, Midlothian, Scot. 55N. 2W. Scots defeated by Protector Somerset (known also as Battle of Musselburgh), 1547; last battle fought between English and Scots.

Pirna, Saxony. 50N. 13E. Defeat of Austrians by Prussians, 1745; of Saxons, 1756; encounters between French and Allies, 1813.

Pisa, Italy. 43N. 10E. Supporter of the Ghibelline cause; under successive masters from 1361; famous church council, 1409; bp. of Galileo (1564-1642).

Pistoia, Italy. 43N. 10E. Passed 1406 into power of Florence; Murat defeated by Austrians, 1815; bp. of Cino, poet and jurist, 13th-14th centuries.

Pitgaveny, Elgin, Scot. 57N. 3W. King Duncan murdered at, 1040.

Plescow, Pskov, Russia. 57N. 28E. Besieged by Gustavus Adolphus, 1615 (Russo-Swedish W.).

Plevna, Bulgaria. 43N. 24E. Osman Pasha surrendered to Russians after siege of 143 days, 1877 (Russo-Turkish W.).

Plymouth, Devons., En. 50N. 4W. Sailing port of Drake, 1572, Sir Humphrey Gilbert, 1583, Sir J. Hawkins, 1595, the two last never returned; here the admirals assembled to await the Armada, 1588; 'Pilgrim Fathers' left in 1620; in hands of Parliamentarians during Civil W.; bp. of Sir J. Hawkins.

Plympton, Devons., En. 50N. 4W. Prince Maurice at, 1643; taken by Essex, 1644; bp. of Sir Joshua Reynolds (1723-92).

Poitiers, France. 46N. 0E. Alaric II. defeated and killed by Clovis at Vouillé near, 507; Saracen power crushed by Charles Martel near, 732; King John defeated by Black Prince, 1356.

Pola, Austria-Hungary. 44N. 13E. Naval victory of Genoese over Venetians, 1379; headquarters of the Austrian Fleet.

Poligny, France. 46N. 5E. A res. of the Counts and Dukes of Burgundy; sc. several sieges from time of Louis XI., 1479 to 1674.

Polotsk, Russia. 55N. 28E. Sc. two engagements between French and Russians during Moscow campaign, 1812.

Pompeii, Italy. 40N. 14E. Destroyed by eruption of Vesuvius, A.D. 79.

Pontefract, Yorkshire, En. 53N. 1W. Richard II. murdered, 1400; captured after successive sieges by Lambert, 1649.

Ponthieu, France. 50N. 1E. Harold wrecked off the coast of, and delivered up to William, 1064.

Pontoise, France. 49N. 2E. Here Louis IX. made his vow to undertake a crusade; taken in turns by English and French during Hundred Years' W.

Pont Valain, France. 47N. 0E. English defeated by Du Guesclin, 1370.

Portisham, Dorsets., En. 50N. 2W. Bp. of Nelson's Hardy, vice-admiral (1769-1839).

Portland Dorset, En. 50N. 2W. Three

days' naval fight between Blake, Deane, and Monk, and the Dutch under Van Tromp, De Ruyter, and Evetzen; the latter were defeated, 1653.

Portsmouth, Hants, En. 50N. 1W. Duke of Buckingham assassinated by Felton, 1628; Charles II. married to Catherine of Braganza, 1661; bp. of Sir W. Besant (1836-1901), and of George Meredith; Dickens born at Portsea.

Possagno, Italy. 45N. 12E. Bp. of Canova, sculptor (1757-1822).

Potsdam, Prussia. 52N. 13E. Tombs of the Hohenzollerns; Sans Souci, res. of Frederick the Great; bp. of Wilhelm von Humboldt, philologist, friend of Schiller and Goethe (1767-1835).

Prague, Bohemia. 50N. 14E. Taken by Ziska and Hussites, 1419; 'Defenestration which began the Thirty Years' W., 1618; Elector Frederick defeated, 1620; Austrians defeated by Koenigsmarck, 1648; celebrated siege sustained by French, and famous retreat (W. of Austrian Succession), 1742; Austrians defeated by Frederick the Great (Seven Years' W.), 1757; Congress, 1813; insurrection, 1848; peace between Austria and Prussia, 1866.

Prenzlau, Prussia. 53N. 13E. Taken by Murat, 1806.

Presburg, Hungary. 48N. 17E. Later kings of Hungary crowned at; taken by Gabor Bethlen, who was proclaimed king the following year (1620); by Austrians, 1621; bombarded by Davout, 1809; Treaty between Napoleon and Emperor after Austerlitz, 1805.

Prescott, Lancashire, En. 53N. 2W. Bp. of John P. Kemble the actor (1757-1823).

Prestonpans, Haddingtons., Scot. 55N. 2W. English defeated by Prince Charles Edward, 1745.

Primolano, Italy. 45N. 11E. Austrians defeated by Napoleon, 1796.

Princes Risborough, Bucks., En. 51N. 0W. Site of palace of Black Prince.

Puente de la Reyna, Spain. 42N. 1W. Republicans defeated by Carlists, 1872.

Pultowa, Poltava, Russia. 49N. 34E. Charles XII. defeated by Peter the Great, 1709. (See *Voltaire's Life of Charles XII.*)

Pultusk, Poland. 52N. 21E. Saxons defeated by Charles XII., 1703; Russians by French, 1806.

Putney, Surrey, En. 51N. 0W. Bp. of Thomas Cromwell, Earl of Essex (1485 (?)-1540).

Quatre Bras, Belgium. 50N. 4E. Ney defeated by Wellington, June 16, 1815.

Quedlinburg, Prussia. 51N. 11E. Bp. of Klopstock, A. of the 'Messiah' (1724-1803).

Quistello, Italy. 45N. 11E. Victory over French by Prince Eugène, 1734 (W. of Polish Succession).

Raab, Austria-Hungary. 47N. 17E. Defeat of Austrians by French under Eugène Beauharnais, 1809.

Radcot Bridge, England. 51N. 1W. Defeat of Richard II.'s forces by those of Henry IV., 1387.

Raeberry Castle, Galloway, Scot. 54N. 4E. The 'Ellangowan New Place' of 'Guy Mannering'.

Ragatz, Switzerland. 47N. 9E. Victory of Swiss confederates over Austrians, 1446 (Armagnac W.).

Raglan Castle, Monmouths., En. 51N. 2W. Charles I. at, after Naseby, 1645; surrendered to Fairfax, 1646.

Ragusa, Austria-Hungary. 42N. 18E. Formerly a small republic; occupied by the French, 1806; assigned to Austria by Congress of Vienna, 1815.

Rambervilliers, France. 48N. 6E. Held against the Germans, 1870.

Ramillies, Belgium. 50N. 4E. French defeated by Marlborough, 1706.

Ramsbottom, Lancashire, En. 53N. 2W. Home of Dickens' 'Cheeryble Brothers.'

Rapperschwy, Switzerland. 47N. 8E. A republic from 1458-1798.

Ratisbon (Regensburg), Bavaria. 49N. 12E. Several times besieged, 1631-41; taken by Napoleon after five days' fighting, 1809; Imperial diets held at, 1656-1806; Interim signed, 1541; armistice (France and Austria), 1684; bp. of F. M. Grimm, A. of the 'Correspondence' (1723-1807).

Ratzburg, Germany. 53N. 10E. Coleridge at as student.

Ravenna, Italy. 44N. 12E. Made capital of Western Empire by Honorius, 404; res. of Odoacer, and of Theodoric, King of the Ostrogoths; later papal possession; victory over the Holy League and death of Gaston de Foix, 1512; Byron at, 1819-21; tombs of Theodoric and of Dante, who died here.

Ré, Rhé, island, France. 46N. 1W. Surrendered by English to Charles VII., 1457; fruitless siege under Duke of Buckingham, July-October, 1627.

Reading, Berks, En. 51N. 0W. Defeat of Ethelred and Alfred by Danes, 871; sur-

rendered to Parliamentarians, 1643; skirmish between troops of James II. and Prince of Orange, 1688; bp. of Archbishop Laud (1573-1645).

Rebec, Italy. 45N. 10E. French defeated by Austrians, death of Bayard, 1524.

Reggio, Italy (Calabria). 38N. 15E. Taken in turns by Alaric, Totila, Saracens and Normans, 5th-11th centuries; sacked by Barbarossa, 1544; by Turks, 1588; destroyed by earthquake, 1783.

Reggio, Italy (Modena). 44N. 10E. Taken by Guiscard, 1060; by French and Imperialists, 1702, 1706; bp. of Ariosto (1474-1533).

Reigate, Surrey, En. 51N. 0W. Grave of Lord Howard of Effingham, Lord High Admiral at the time of the Armada (1570 (?) 73).

Reims, France. 49N. 4E. Famous cathedral town, sacked by Vandals and Attila, 5th century; Clovis baptised at, 496; French kings from Philippe Auguste consecrated at; besieged by Edward III., 1359; English possession, 1421-29, when taken by Joan of Arc; occupied by the Russians, 1814.

Rennes, France (Brittany). 48N. 1W. Besieged by English, 1356; Parliament held by Henri II., 1553.

Rethel, France. 49N. 4E. Taken and taken by Condé and Turenne during the wars of the Fronde, 1650-55.

Rheinberg, Rhenish Prussia. 51N. 6E. French victory over Hanoverians, 1760.

Rheinfelden, Switzerland. 47N. 7E. Two battles (Thirty Years' W.), in which first Austrians and then French were victors, 1638; Austrians defeated, 1678.

Rhodes, island, Mediterranean. 36N. 28E. Knights of St. John established in 1310; vainly besieged by Turks, 1479; secured to Turks by Soliman II., 1522; famous 'Laocoon' found on in 1506.

Rhuddlan, Flint., Wa. 53N. 3W. Caradoc defeated by Offa, 795; statutes of issued by Edward I., 1284; taken by Parliamentarians, 1646.

Richmond, Surrey, En. 51N. 0W. Tournament held by Henry VII., 1492; Queen Elizabeth died, 1603; Ass. Swift and 'Stella'; grave of Thomson, poet of the 'Seasons.'

Rickmansworth, Herts, En. 51N. 0W. William Penn, f. of Pennsylvania, a resident, 1672-77.

Rieti, Italy. 42N. 12E. Defeat of Neapolitans by Austrians, and reinstatement of King Ferdinand, 1821.

Riga, Russia. 57N. 24E. Held by small body of Poles, and finally taken by Gustavus Adolphus (Thirty Years' W.), 1621; held by Russia since 1710.

Rimini, Italy. 44N. 12E. The Malatesta in power from 13th to 16th century, when they were driven out by Cæsar Borgia, 1528; Francesco di R. has been immortalised by Dante. (See also dramas by D'Annunzio and Stephen Phillips; Byron's 'Parisina' was a Malatesta.)

Rimnik, Roumania. 45N. 27E. Grand Vizier and his Turks routed by Austrians and Russians, 1789.

Rivoli, Italy (Venetia). 45N. 7E. Austrians defeated by Napoleon, 1797.

Robroyston, Ayr, Scot. 55N. 4W. Wallace captured, 1305.

Rochefort-sur-mer, France. 45N. 0W. Napoleon surrendered to Captain Maitland, of the 'Bellerophon,' 1815.

Rochelle, La, France. 46N. 1W. Huguenot stronghold, valiantly defended against Catholic forces, 1572 and 1573; taken by Richelieu after 13 months' siege, 1628.

Rochester, Kent, En. 51N. 0E. Commemorated in several of Dickens' works; his home, 'Gadshill,' is near.

Roehford, Essex, En. 51N. 0E. One of the places at which Anne Boleyn is said to have been born (see Blickling).

Rocourt, Belgium. 50N. 5E. Imperialists defeated by Maurice de Saxe (W. of Austrian Succession), 1746.

Rocroi, France. 49N. 4E. Victory of Condé over Spaniards, 1643 and 1653 (Thirty Years' W.).

Rodemack, Alsace-Lorraine. 49N. 6E. Bravely held against the Prussians in 1792 and 1815.

Rohrau, Austria. 48N. 16E. Bp. of Haydn, the composer (1732-1809).

Rokeby, Yorks, En. 54N. 1W. Commemorated in Scott's poem.

Rolica, Portugal. 39N. 9W. French driven from by Wellington (Peninsular W.), 1808.

Romano, Italy (Piedmont). 45N. 7E. Austrians defeated by Napoleon, 1800.

Rome, Italy. 41N. 12E. Seat of empire removed from to Byzantium by Constantine, 330; division of empire into East and West, 364; overrun by barbarians, 5th century; Charlemagne crowned emperor at, 800; suffered several sieges during long struggle between popes and emperors, ending with death of Frederick II., 1250; republic proclaimed by Rienzi, 1347; by Berthier, 1798; made part of French empire, 1808; restored to pope, 1814; French in occupation, 1849-70; revolt of papal states, 1860; capital of the united kingdom of Italy since 1870.

Roncesvalles, Spain. 42N. 1W. Charlemagne's rearguard attacked, and Roland and other peers slain, 778, subject of old Chanson de Geste; held by the English against Soult (Peninsular W.), 1813.

Rosbecque, Belgium. 50N. 3E. Defeat of Flemings by Charles VI., and death of Philip van Artevelde, 1382.

Roscoff, France. 48N. 3W. Landing of Mary Queen of Scots, 1548.

Roseneath, Ayr, Scot. 56N. 4W. Seat of Duke of Argyle. (See Scott, 'Heart of Midlothian'.)

Roskild, Denmark. 55N. 12E. Ancient capital.

Rosny-sur-Seine, France. 49N. 1E. Bp. of Sully, companion and minister of Henri IV. (1560-1641).

Ross, Hereford, En. 51N. 2W. House and grave of John Kyrle, 'Man of R.' (d. 1724), immortalised by Pope.

Roszbach, Prussia. 51N. 11E. Victory of Frederick the Great over French and Austrians (Seven Years' W.), 1757.

Rosslyn, Midlothian, Scot. 55N. 3W. English defeated by Scots, 1303; ass. visits of Wordsworth, Burns, and Dr. Johnson. (See Scott, 'Lay of the Last Minstrel'.)

Rostock, Mecklenburg-Schwerin. 54N. 12E. Defeat of Swedes by Danes, 1677; tomb of Grotius (1583-1646); bp. of Blücher, our ally at Waterloo.

Rothsay, Bute, Scot. 55N. 5W. Res. of early Stuart kings.

Rothiere, La, France. Fierce fight between Allies and Napoleon, leaving the latter victor, 1814.

Rotterdam, Holland. 51N. 4E. Suffered during wars of the Revolution; bp. of Erasmus (1465-1536). (See Motley, op. cit.)

Rouen, France. 49N. 1E. Possession of Dukes of Normandy from 9th to 13th century; taken by Philippe Auguste, 1204; by Henry V., 1419; trial and death of Joan of Arc, 1431; suffered during religious warfare in 16th century; bp. of Corneille, the father of French tragedy (1606-84). Famous Cathedral at.

Roulers, Belgium. 50N. 3E. Austrians defeated by French, 1794.

Roundway Down, Wilts., En. 51N. 1W. Waller defeated by Royalists, 1643.

Rouvray, France. 48N. 1E. 'Battle of the Herrings' in which Sir John Fastolf distinguished himself, 1429.

Roveredo, Tyrol. 45N. 11E. Austrians defeated by Napoleon, 1796.

Rowton, Salop, En. 52N. 2W. Bp. of Richard Baxter (1615-91).

Rowton Heath, Cheshire, En. 53N. 2W. Royalists defeated, 1645.

Roxburgh, Scot. 55N. 2W. Taken from English by James II. of Scotland, who was killed by explosion of a gun, 1460.

Rullion Green, Pentlands, Scot. 55N. 3W. Covenanters defeated by Royalists, 1666.

Rumersheim, Alsace-Lorraine. 47N. 7E. Imperialists defeated by French (W. of Spanish Succession), 1709.

Runnimead, Surrey, En. 51N. 0W. Magna Charta signed by King John, 1215.

Rustchuk, Bulgaria. 43N. 25E. Former Turkish fort; fought for by Russians and Turks, 1809-11 and 1854; taken by Russians, 1877.

Rutherglen, Lanark, Scot. 55N. 4W. Several times besieged in the days of the Bruce; destroyed by Regent Moray, 1568; now a thriving suburb of Glasgow.

Ruthwell, Dumfries, Scot. 55N. 3W. Famous cross, inscribed with verses from Anglo-Saxon poem.

Rüti, Grütli, Switzerland. 46N. 8E. Meadow where the men of the cantons took the oath to drive out the Austrians, 1307.

Rye, Sussex, En. 50N. 0E. Bp. of

Fletcher, the dramatist (1579-1625). (See Thackeray's 'Denis Duval'.)

Ryswick, Holland. 52N. 4E. Treaty of Peace (France, England, Spain, Germany, and Netherlands), 1697.

Saalfeld-an-der-Saale, Saxe-Meiningen, Germany. 50N. 11E. Prussians defeated by the French, 1806.

Saarbrück, Prussia. 49N. 6E. First engagement of Franco-German W., 1870.

Saardam (Zaandam), Holland. 52N. 4E. Here Peter the Great apprenticed himself as a carpenter to learn shipbuilding, 1697.

Saarlouis, Prussia. 49N. 6E. Bp. of Marshal Ney, who rejoined Napoleon in 1815, fought at Waterloo, and was shot that same year.

Sables-d'Olonne, France. 46N. 1W. Destroyed by English-Dutch fleet, 1666.

Sabugal, Portugal. 40N. 7W. French driven back by Wellington, 1811 (Peninsular W.).

Sacile, Italy. 45N. 12E. Eugène Beauharnais defeated by Austrians, 1809.

Sadowa, Bohemia. 50N. 15E. Austrians defeated by Prussians, 1866 (known also as battle of Königgratz).

Sagres, Portugal. 37N. 8W. Burnt by Drake, 1597.

Sagunto (Murviedro), Spain. 39N. 16W. Siege by Soult and final surrender to, 1811 (Peninsular W.).

St. Albans, Herts, En. 51N. 0W. Ancient cathedral town. Tombs of Sir Francis Bacon and Duke Humphrey of Gloucester; at Sopwell Nunnery near Juliana Berners wrote her famous book of the chase, known as 'The Boke of S. Albans,' written in the early 15th century; the Yorkists won a victory here in 1455; the Lancastrians, 1461.

Saint-Amant-Mont-Rond, France. 47N. 2E. Taken in turns by English and by Charles VI.

St. Andrews, Fife, Scot. 56N. 2W. Wishart martyred and Cardinal Beaton murdered, 1546.

St. Aubin-du-Cormier, France. 48N. 1W. Victory of La Tremoille over the Bretons, 1488.

Saint-Cast, France. 48N. 3W. English defeated, 1758.

St. Cloud, France. 48N. 2E. Henri III. assassinated, 1589; a favourite res. of Napoleon; capitulation of Paris signed, 1815; castle destroyed, 1870 (Franco-Prussian W.).

St. Cyr, France. 48N. 2E. Here Mme de Maintenon died and was buried.

St. Davids, Pembroke, Wa. 51N. 5W. Former resort of pilgrims, among them the Conqueror and later kings; tomb of Edmund Tudor, father of Henry VII.

St. Denis, France. 48N. 2E. For twelve centuries the necropolis of the French kings (tombs of Dagobert, Louis XII., Francis I., Henri II., and Catherine de' Medici, etc., also of famous generals, Du Guesclin, Turenne, etc.); Suger, the great statesman (cir. 1081-1151), was brought up here; victory of Catholics over Protestants, and death

of Montmency, 1567; bombarded by Germans, 1871.

Saint-Dizier, France. 48N. 4E. Allies defeated near by Napoleon, 1814.

St. Gall, Switzerland. 47N. 9E. A chief source for the history of Charlemagne was the work of a monk of this abbey.

St. Germain-en-Laye, France. 48N. 2E. Former res. of French kings and where Louis XIV. and several of his predecessors were born; res. of James II. of England for the last two years of his life, and where he lies buried.

Saint-Gilles-sur-Vie, France. 46N. 1W. Victory of Louis XIII. over Protestants, 1622; defeat of Vendéans, 1815.

Saint-Gothard, Hungary. 46N. 16E. Turks driven out of Hungary by Austrians under Montecuculi and French under Coligny, 1664.

St. Helena, Atlantic. 15S. 5W. English possession since 1673; Napoleon a prisoner on from 1815 to his death.

St. Ives, Huntingdon, En. 52N. 0W. Res. of Cromwell, 1631-36.

Saint-Jacques, Basle, Switzerland. 47N. 7E. Celebrated for the stand made by a small body of Swiss, who were all slain, against a large French force, 1444.

Saint-Jean-de-Losne, France. 47N. 4E. Held by a small garrison against besieging Germans and Spaniards, 1636.

Saint-Jean-de-Luz, Pyrenees. 43N. 1W. Louis XIV. married at.

Saint-Just, Estramadura, Spain. 50N. 5W. To this monastery Charles V. retired after his abdication, and here two years later died, 1558.

Saint-Leu-Taverny, France. 48N. 2E. Tombs of Napoleon's father, and of his brother Louis, King of Holland, and of Marshal Ney.

St. Lô, France. 49N. 1W. Taken in turns by French and English, 1203-1449; bp. of Octave Feuillet, novelist and dramatist.

St. Macaire, France. 44N. 0W. Taken by Henry III. of England, 1253; sc. several later sieges.

St. Malo, France. 48N. 2W. Bp. of the early navigator Jacques Cartier, of Chateaubriand, who is also buried here (1768-1848), and of Lamennais (1782-1854).

St. Michel, France, see Mont St. Michel.

Saint-Omer, France. 50N. 2E. Sc. many sieges by French kings and Imperialists from the 11th century; saved from Marlborough and Prince Eugene by the efforts of a woman, Jacqueline Robin, 1711; bp. of Suger, the great French statesman of the early 12th century.

St. Petersburg, Russia. 59N. 30E. F. by Peter the Great, 1703.

Saint-Pierre-Port, Guernsey. 49N. 2W. Hugo's home during his exile, 1856-70.

Saint-Point, France. 46N. 4E. Castle and tomb of the poet Lamartine (1790-1869).

St. Quentin, France. 49N. 3E. French defeated by English and Spanish forces, 1557; French defeated by Germans, 1871. (See Dumas, 'The Two Dianas'.)

Saint-Remy, France. 45N. 5E. Bp. of the famous astrologer, Nostradamus (1503-66).

Saint-Valéry-sur-Somme, France. 50N. 1E. Whence William the Conqueror set sail for England, 1066.

St. Vincent, Cape, Portugal. 37N. 9W. Rooke defeated by French off, 1693; success of Rodney over Spaniards, 1780; defeat of Spaniards by Jervis, 1797; victory of Sir Charles Napier over Don Miguel, 1833.

Sainte-Sevère, France. 46N. 1E. Taken from the English by Du Guesclin, 1372.

Salamanca, Spain. 40N. 5W. Taken by French, 1812; victory of Wellington over Marmont, 1812 (Peninsular W.); contains one of the oldest monasteries in Europe.

Salcombe, S. Devon, En. 50N. 3W. Grave of Froude, the historian.

Salerno, town and province, Italy. 40N. 14E. Defeat of Saracens by Norman knights, 1016; taken by Robert Guiscard, 1075; town destroyed by Emperor Henry IV., 1193.

Salisbury, Wilts, En. 51N. 1W. Famous circular group of stones known as Stonehenge. The 'Barset' of Trollope.

Salonica, Turkey. 40N. 22E. Taken from Venetians by Turks, 1430.

Saluzzo, Italy. 44N. 7E. Bp. of Silvio Pellico, dramatist and prose writer (1788-1854).

Salzbach, Baden. 48N. 7E. Marshal Turenne killed, 1675.

Salzburg, Austria. 47N. 13E. Emigration of persecuted Protestants, 1732. (See Goethe, 'Hermann u. Dorothea'.)

Sandridge, near Dartmouth, En. 50N. 3W. Bp. of John Davis, navigator of the 16th century.

Sandwich, Kent, En. 51N. 1E. Defeat of Danes by Athelstan, 851; landing-place of Sweyn and Canute; more than once burnt by the French in 15th century.

Sandy Knowe, Roxburgh, Scot. 55N. 2W. Sir Walter Scott some years at when a child.

Sanguhar, Dumfriess., Scot. 55N. 3W. Taken by Scots and English garrison slaughtered, 1297; hither Mary Queen of Scots rode in hot haste after disaster of Langside, and hence escaped to England; Declaration of Covenanters, 1680 (see Aird's Moss); bp. of the 'Admirable' Crichton (cir. 1560-82).

San Sebastian, Spain. 43N. 1W. Taken by the French, 1808; stormed by Wellington, 1813; Carlists forced to raise siege, 1836 (Carlist W.).

Santander, Spain. 43N. 3W. Sacked by Soult, 1808.

Santiago de Compostella, Spain. 42N. 8W. Famous resort of pilgrims in the Middle Ages.

Saorge, Maritime Alps. 44N. 6E. Taken by Masséna, 1794.

Saragossa, Spain. 41N. 0W. Taken from the Moors after a 5 years' siege, 1118; besieged by French, June to August, 1808, December to February, 1808-9, when the

'Maid of Saragossa' distinguished herself. (See Byron, 'Childe Harold,' Canto I.)

Sardinia, Mediterranean. 40N. 9E. Transferred from Spain to Austria by Treaty of Utrecht, 1714; since then in possession in turns of Dukes of Savoy and the French.

Sarzeau, Brittany, France. 47N. 2W. Bp. of Le Sage, A. of 'Gil Blas' (1668-1747).

Sasun (Sassoon), Armenia. 39N. 42E. Sc. atrocities committed by Kurds and Turks, 1803-4.

Sauchie (Sauchieburn), Stirling, Scot. 56N. 3W. James III. of Scotland defeated and slain, 1488.

Saulieu, France. 47N. 4E. Burnt by the English, 1359.

Saumur, France. 47N. 0W. Centre of Calvinism until revocation of Edict of Nantes, 1685; taken by Vendéans, 1793; insurrection under General Berton, 1822.

Sauve, France. 43N. 3E. Sided with Calvinists, 1620; taken, and soon lost again, by Camisards, 1702; Florian, French versifier of fables, was born near (1755-94).

Savenay, France. 47N. 1W. Vendéans defeated by republicans, 1795.

Savernake, Wilts., En. 51N. 1W. Wolf Hall, bp. of Jane Seymour.

Savona, Italy. 44N. 8E. Bombarded by English, 1746; taken by French, 1809, and the Pope held prisoner by Napoleon till 1812.

Scandiano, Italy. 44N. 10E. Bp. of the poet Boiardo, A. of 'Orlando Innamorato' (1430-94).

Scarborough, Yorks., En. 54N. 0W. Bp. of Sir F. Leighton (1830-96); grave of Anne Brontë, d. 1849.

Scheibenberg, Austria. 47N. 13E. Austrians defeated by Marlborough, 1704.

Scheveningen, Holland. 52N. 4E. Dutch fleet defeated and Tromp killed by English under Monk, 1653.

Schlettstadt, Alsace-Lorraine. 48N. 7E. Taken by Germans, 1870; bp. of Bucer, the Reformer (1491-1551).

Schlussemburg, Russia. 60N. 32E. Fort where Ivan VI. was for 23 years imprisoned and then murdered.

Schmalkalden, Prussia. 50N. 10E. Protestant League concluded, 1537.

Schoenbrunn, Austria. 48N. 16E. Peace signed between Napoleon and Austria, 1809; death of his son, the Duke de Reichstadt, 1832. (See 'L'Aiglon' by Rostand.)

Schweidnitz, Prussia. 50N. 16E. Held against Frederick the Great during long siege, 1761-2; taken by French, 1807.

Schweinfurt, Bavaria. 50N. 10E. Bp. of the poet Rückert (1789-1866).

Scilly Islands, Cornwall, En. 49N. 6W. Taken by Athelstan, 938; leased by Elizabeth to Sir F. Godolphin; Sir Cloudesley Shovel, Admiral, drowned off, with loss of his ship, 1707.

Scone, Perth, Scot. 56N. 3W. Coronation place of Scottish kings; 'stone' carried off by Edward I., 1296.

Scutari, Turkey in Asia. 41N. 29E. Military

hospital during Crimean W. ass. with Florence Nightingale.

Sebastopol, Crimea, Russia. 44N. 33E. Eleven months' siege during Crimean W., 1854-55. (See Tolstoy, 'Sevastopol'.)

Sedan, France. 49N. 4E. Capitulated to the Germans, 1815; defeat and surrender of Napoleon III., 1870; bp. of Marshal Turenne (1611-75).

Sedgemoor, Somerset, En. 51N. 2W. Mouth defeated by royal forces, 1685.

Segovia, Spain. 40N. 4W. Sacked by the French, 1808.

Selborne, Hants, En. 51N. 0W. House where Gilbert White, A. of 'Natural History of S.' was born and died (1720-93).

Selby, Yorks., En. 53N. 1W. Bp. of Henry I.; taken by Fairfax, 1644.

Seminara, Italy. Gonzalvo de Cordova defeated by D'Aubigné, 1495; himself victor, 1503; Neapolitans defeated by French, 1807.

Serlin, Hungary. 44N. 20E. Remains of castle of John Hunyadi, where he died.

Sempach, Switzerland. 47N. 8E. Memorable victory of the Swiss over Austrians, 1386.

Senlac, see Hastings.

Sens, France. 48N. 3E. Besieged for a fortnight by the Allies, 1814.

Seville, Spain. 37N. 5W. Taken from the Moors by Ferdinand III. of Castile, 1248; treaty between England and Spain signed, 1729; French in possession, 1810-12; bp. of the Spanish painters Murillo and Velasquez.

Sezannes, France. 48N. 3E. Besieged by the English, 1423; by the Huguenots, 1566; sacked by the Allies, 1814.

Shaftesbury, Dorset, En. 51N. 2W. Death of Canute at, 1035; burial place of Edward the Martyr, murdered at Corfe Castle, 978.

Shanklin, Isle of Wight. 50N. 1W. Keats at, 1817; here he began his 'Endymion'.

Sheerness, Kent, En. 51N. 0E. Taken by De Ruyter, 1667.

Sheffield, Yorks., En. 53N. 1W. Castle taken by Parliamentarians, 1644.

Sherbourne, Dorset, En. 50N. 2W. Castle built by Raleigh and taken by Fairfax, 1645; graves of Asser, bishop of S., King Alfred's biographer, and of two of the king's brothers. Sheriffmuir, Perth, Scot. 56N. 3W. Indecisive action between Jacobites and Hanoverians, 1715.

Sherwood Forest, Notts, En. 53N. 1W. Ass. Robin Hood, the hero of many old ballads.

Shetland Islands, Scot. 60N. 1W. (See Scott, 'Pirate'.)

Shipka Pass, Balkans. 42N. 25E. Held by the Russians against severe odds, 1877 (Russo-Turkish W.).

Shrewsbury, Salop, En. 52N. 2W. Battle in which Hotspur was killed, 1403.

Sicily, Italy. 37N. 14E. Part of the kingdom of the Two Sicilies under the Normans, and again at intervals under succeeding dynasties; governed in turns by the house of Anjou, Hohenstaufen, Aragon, Savoy,

Hapsburg, and Bourbon; finally incorporated with Italy, 1861.

Siena, Italy. 43N. 11E. Sofia, Bulgaria. 42N. 23E. Present capital of principality.

Soissons, France. 49N. 3E. Victory of Clovis over Roman general Syagrius, 486 (ass. the episode of the 'Vase de Soissons'); of Charles Martel over Chilperic, 719, and Charles the Simple over Robert, who was killed, 922; Charles himself defeated, 923; sc. frequent sieges during Hundred Years'; religious, and Napoleonic W.; taken by Germans, 1870.

**Valladolid**, Spain. 41N. 4W. Sacked by the French, 1808; Napoleon's headquarters, 1809.

**Valmy**, France. 49N. 4E. Prussians defeated by Dumouriez, 1792.

**Varennes**, France. 49N. 5E. Louis XVI. and his family captured on their flight, 1791. (See Carlyle, 'French Revolution,')

**Varna**, Bulgaria. 43N. 27E. Taken from Turks after long siege by Russians under Mentschikoff, 1828.

**Vaucluse**, France. 44N. 5E. Res. for a while of Petrarch, who has immortalised its 'Fountain.'

**Vendome**, France. 47N. 1E. German victory near, 1870 (Franco-Prussian W.).

**Venice**, Italy. 45N. 12E. First doge, 697; chief maritime power of the Adriatic, in rivalry with Genoa, 13th and 14th centuries; chief commercial power of Europe until discovery of other routes to India at close of 15th century; Austrian possession, 1798-1805, and from 1814 till incorporated in kingdom of Italy, 1866, although bravely struggling for independence in 1849. (See Ruskin, 'Stones of Venice,')

**Verdun**, France. 49N. 5E. Taken by Germans after long siege, 1870.

**Verona**, Italy. 45N. 11E. Home of the Capulets and Montagues (see 'Romeo and Juliet'); the Scala family in power, 13th-14th centuries; in turn, Venetian and Austrian possession, 1405-1805; Italian, 1805-15; Austrian, 1815-66; Congress of the Holy Alliance, of which Chateaubriand left an account, 1822.

**Versailles**, France. 48N. 2E. Peace of (England and United States) 1783; meeting of states-general, 1789; capitulation of Paris signed, 1871.

**Vezelay**, France. 47N. 3E. Here the first crusade was preached by St. Bernard, 1143, and Richard I. and Philippe Auguste took the cross, 1187.

**Vienna**, Austria. 48N. 16E. Taken by Mathias Corvin, King of Hungary, 1485; twice besieged by Turks, 1529 and 1683, when relieved by Sobieski; occupied by Napoleon, 1805-9; famous Congress of Allied Powers, 1814-15.

**Vigo**, Spain. 42N. 8W. Victory of Drake, 1585; 1589; of Sir George Rooke (capture of Spanish galleons), 1702; of Lord Cobham, 1711.

**Villafranca**, Italy. 45N. 10E. Peace of (France and Austria), 1859.

**Villers-Cotterets**, France. 49N. 3E. Bp. of Alexandre Dumas (1803-70).

**Vimiero**, Portugal. 39N. 9W. Junot defeated by Wellington, 1808.

**Waltham**, Essex, En. 51N. 0. Traditional grave of Harold and his two brothers, slain at Hastings; cross to Queen Eleanor.

**Walthamstow**, Essex, En. 51N. 0E. Bp. of William Morris (1834-96).

**Wantage**, Berks, En. 51N. 1W. Bp. of King Alfred.

**Ware**, Herts, En. 51N. 0W. 'Town of fame.' (See 'John Gilpin,')

**Warsaw**, Poland. 52N. 21E. Taken by Charles XII. (See Voltaire, op. cit.), 1703; by Suvarov, 1794; taken from Prussians by Murat, 1806; ceded to Russia, 1815; revolt of Poland in 1830, 1848, 1863.

**Wartburg**, 50N. 10E. Celebrated contest of the 'Minnesinger' 1207 at the Court of the Landgrave of Thuringia. Here Luther wrote his translation of the Bible, 1522.

**Warwick**, cap. of county, En. 52N. 1W. Unsuccessfully besieged by Royalists, 1642.

**Waterford**, cap. of county, Ir. 52N. 7W. Early Danish settlement; taken by Strongbow, 1170; capitulated to Ireton, 1650. (See Kingsley, 'Hereward the Wake,')

**Waterloo**, Belgium. 50N. 4E. Battle of, June 18, 1815.

**Watling Street**, old Roman road running North and West from Dover.

**Wavre**, Belgium. 50N. 4E. Prussians held Grouchy in check, 1815 (Battle of Waterloo).

**Wedmore**, Somersets. 51N. 2W. Peace

of, between Alfred and Danes, after battle of Edington, 878.

Weimar, Germany. 50N. 11E. Res. of Goethe, of Schiller, Herder, Wieland, etc.; bp. of Kotzebue (1761-1819).

Wellow, East, Hants. 50N. 1W. Early home and grave of Florence Nightingale, d. 1910.

Welwyn, Herts, En. 51N. 0W. Young, as vicar (1730-65), wrote his 'Night Thoughts' here, and is buried in the church.

Wemyss, Fife, Scot. 56N. 3W. Here Mary and Darnley first met.

Wexford, cap. of county, Ir. 52N. 6W. Res. in 12th century of Strongbow; stormed by Cromwell, 1649; massacre of inhabitants by rebels, 1798.

Whithy, Yorks, En. 54N. 0W. Caedmon, A.-Saxon poet, 7th century, lay brother under the Abbess Hilda (see Scott, 'Marmion'), here had the vision that inspired his poetic genius.
