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This work has grown out of a special interest on 'Media and Society' in modern times keeping in view the modern trends in historical writings. It was a longstanding professional urge to discover and report on what media had been doing for this country. The emergence of the Indian press, properly so called, was the product and a stimulant of the process of national regeneration that began in the 19th century. Similarly, different types of associations, either socio-cultural or political have also got much credit to reframe our social structure and social changes. In trying to define and to promote it, the press and associations have been playing an important part to focus on so many important aspects of our society. We know that the press is the mirror of public opinion and a chronicles of social, political and cultural events. Out of this belief the present work has been undertaken to know about the role of the press and associations of North Bengal, a particular geographical area, both in the pre-partition and post-partition period.
